18 The appropriations in this section are subject to the
19 following conditions and limitations:

20 (1) AGENCY OPERATIONS

21 (a) \$770,000 of the general fund--state appropriation is
22 provided solely for the operation and expenses of the state board
23 of education, including basic education assistance activities.

24 (b) \$659,000 of the general fund--state appropriation is
25 provided solely for investigation activities of the office of
26 professional practices.

27 (c) \$1,700,000 of the general fund--state appropriation is
28 provided solely to reprogram computer applications for collecting
29 and processing school fiscal, personnel, and student data and for
30 calculating apportionment payments and to upgrade agency computer

1 hardware. A maximum of \$600,000 of this amount shall be used for
2 computer hardware.

3 By December 15, 1995, and before implementation of a new
4 state-wide data system, the superintendent shall present a plan to
5 the house of representatives and senate education and fiscal
6 committees which identifies state data base uses that could involve
7 potentially sensitive data on students and parents. The plan shall
8 detail methods that the superintendent shall employ internally and
9 recommend to school organizations to insure integrity and proper
10 use of data in any student data base, with particular attention to
11 eliminating unnecessary and intrusive data about nonschool related
12 information.

13 (d) The entire public safety and education account
14 appropriation is provided solely for administration of the traffic
15 safety education program, including in-service training related to
16 instruction in the risks of driving while under the influence of
17 alcohol and other drugs.

18 (2) STATE-WIDE PROGRAMS

19 (a) \$2,174,000 of the general fund--state appropriation is
20 provided for in-service training and educational programs conducted
21 by the Pacific Science Center.

22 (b) \$63,000 of the general fund--state appropriation is
23 provided for operation of the Cispus environmental learning center.

24 (c) \$2,654,000 of the general fund--state appropriation is
25 provided for educational centers, including state support
26 activities.

27 (d) \$3,093,000 of the general fund--state appropriation is
28 provided for grants for magnet schools to be distributed as
29 recommended by the superintendent of public instruction pursuant to
30 chapter 232, section 516(13), Laws of 1992.

31 (e) \$4,370,000 of the general fund--state appropriation is
32 provided for complex need grants. Grants shall be provided

1 according to funding ratios established in LEAP Document 30C as
2 developed on May 21, 1995, at 23:46 hours.

3 (f) \$3,050,000 of the drug enforcement and education account
4 appropriation (~~is~~) and \$2,800,000 of the general fund--state
5 appropriation are provided solely for matching grants to enhance
6 security in secondary schools. Not more than seventy-five percent
7 of a district's total expenditures for school security in any
8 school year may be paid from a grant under this subsection. The
9 grants shall be expended solely for the costs of employing or
10 contracting for building security monitors in secondary schools
11 during school hours and school events. Of the amount provided in
12 this subsection, at least \$2,850,000 shall be spent for grants to
13 districts that, during the 1988-89 school year, employed or
14 contracted for security monitors in schools during school hours.
15 However, these grants may be used only for increases in school
16 district expenditures for school security over expenditure levels
17 for the 1988-89 school year.

18 (g) Districts receiving allocations from subsections (2) (d)
19 and (e) of this section shall submit an annual report to the
20 superintendent of public instruction on the use of all district
21 resources to address the educational needs of at-risk students in
22 each school building. The superintendent of public instruction
23 shall make copies of the reports available to the office of
24 financial management and the legislature.

25 (h) \$500,000 of the general fund--federal appropriation is
26 provided for plan development and coordination as required by the
27 federal goals 2000: Educate America Act. The superintendent shall
28 collaborate with the commission on student learning for the plan
29 development and coordination and submit quarterly reports on the
30 plan development to the education committees of the legislature.

31 (i) \$400,000 of the health services account appropriation is
32 provided solely for media productions by students at up to 40 sites
33 to focus on issues and consequences of teenage pregnancy and child

1 rearing. The projects shall be consistent with the provisions of
2 Engrossed Second Substitute House Bill No. 2798 as passed by the
3 1994 legislature, including a local/private or public sector match
4 equal to fifty percent of the state grant; and shall be awarded to
5 schools or consortia not granted funds in 1993-94.

6 (j) \$7,000 of the general fund--state appropriation is
7 provided to the state board of education to establish teacher
8 competencies in the instruction of braille to legally blind and
9 visually impaired students.

10 (k) \$50,000 of the general fund--state appropriation is
11 provided solely for matching grants to school districts for
12 analysis of budgets for classroom-related activities as specified
13 in chapter 230, Laws of 1995.

14 (l) \$3,050,000 of the general fund--state appropriation is
15 provided solely to implement Engrossed Second Substitute Senate
16 Bill No. 5439 (nonoffender at-risk youth). Of that amount, \$50,000
17 is provided for a contract in fiscal year 1996 to the Washington
18 state institute for public policy to conduct an evaluation and
19 review as outlined in section 81 of Engrossed Second Substitute
20 Senate Bill No. 5439. Allocation of the remaining amount shall be
21 based on the number of petitions filed in each district."
