NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 90.58 RCW to read as follows:

19 A regional fisheries enhancement group or cooperative group project that is primarily designed to improve fish habitat or fish passage; has 20 been approved by the department of fish and wildlife; has been given or 21 22 is qualified to be given a hydraulic permit; and has been determined by 23 local government to not substantially affect other concerns of this 24 chapter is exempt from the permitting requirements of this chapter. A 25 letter of exemption must be obtained from the local government, which shall be provided in a timely manner. 26

27 **Sec. 5.** RCW 75.50.110 and 1990 c 58 s 4 are each amended to read 28 as follows:

29 (1) A regional fisheries enhancement group advisory board is established to make recommendations to the director. The advisory board shall assist regional fisheries enhancement 11 groups in soliciting federal, state, and local agencies, tribal 12 governments, institutions of higher education, and private business for 13 the purpose of providing technical assistance and services to regional 14 fisheries enhancement group projects; and
  - (iii) A cost estimate for implementing the plan;

- 36 **Sec. 7.** RCW 75.50.120 and 1990 c 58 s 5 are each amended to read 37 as follows:

- The department and the regional fisheries enhancement group advisory board shall report biennially to the senate ((environment and natural resources committee,)) and the house of representatives ((fisheries and wildlife)) natural resources committees, the senate ways and means committee and house of representatives fiscal committees, or any successor committees beginning October 1, 1991. The report shall include but not be limited to the following:
  - (1) An evaluation of enhancement efforts;
  - (2) A description of projects;

The purpose of field testing efforts shall be 11 to gather conclusive scientific data on the effectiveness of coho and 12 chinook remote site incubators.
- 13 **Sec. 11.** RCW 75.08.230 and 1993 c 340 s 48 are each amended to 14 read as follows:
- 15 (1) Except as provided in this section, state and county officers 16 receiving the following moneys shall deposit them in the state general 17 fund:
- 18 (a) The sale of licenses required under this title;
- 19 (b) The sale of property seized or confiscated under this title;
- 20 (c) Fines and forfeitures collected under this title;
- 21 (d) The sale of real or personal property held for department 22 purposes;
- (e) Rentals or concessions of the department;
- 24 (f) Moneys received for damages to food fish, shellfish or 25 department property; and
- 26 (g) Gifts.
- 27 (2) The director shall make weekly remittances to the state 28 treasurer of moneys collected by the department.
- 29 (3) All fines and forfeitures collected or assessed by a district 30 court for a violation of this title or rule of the director shall be 31 remitted as provided in chapter 3.62 RCW.
- 32 (4) Proceeds from the sale of food fish or shellfish taken in test 33 fishing conducted by the department, to the extent that these proceeds 34 exceed the estimates in the budget approved by the legislature, may be 35 allocated as unanticipated receipts under RCW 43.79.270 to reimburse 36 the department for unanticipated costs for test fishing operations in 37 excess of the allowance in the budget approved by the legislature.

- (5) Proceeds from the sale of salmon <u>carcasses</u> and salmon eggs <u>from</u> 1 state general funded hatcheries by the department((, to the extent 2 3 these proceeds exceed estimates in the budget approved by the 4 legislature, may be allocated as unanticipated receipts under RCW 43.79.270. Allocations under this subsection shall be made only for 5 hatchery operations partially or wholly financed by sources other than 6 7 state general revenues or for purposes of processing human consumable 8 salmon for disposal)) of general administration shall be deposited in 9 the regional fisheries enhancement group account established in RCW 10 75.50.100.
- (6) Moneys received by the director under RCW 75.08.045, to the 11 extent these moneys exceed estimates in the budget approved by the 12 legislature, may be allocated as unanticipated receipts under RCW 13 14 43.79.270. Allocations under this subsection shall be made only for 15 the specific purpose for which the moneys were received, unless the moneys were received in settlement of a claim for damages to food fish 16 17 or shellfish, in which case the moneys may be expended for the conservation of these resources. 18
- 19 (7) Proceeds from the sale of herring spawn on kelp fishery 20 licenses by the department, to the extent those proceeds exceed 21 estimates in the budget approved by the legislature, may be allocated 22 as unanticipated receipts under RCW 43.79.270. Allocations under this 23 subsection shall be made only for herring management, enhancement, and 24 enforcement.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 12. If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 13. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take effect immediately."
