3 On page 3, beginning on line 12, after "surcharge" strike all
4 material through "category." on line 22, and insert "may vary among
5 student categories. The amount of the surcharge levied in one
6 academic year shall not be included in base tuition fees in the
7 next academic year. In any academic year, the total amount of
8 revenue raised through the surcharge shall not exceed fifteen
9 percent of the revenue raised through base tuition fees in that
10 academic year."

12 On page 5, beginning on line 3, after "surcharge" strike all
13 material through "category." on line 13, and insert "may vary among
14 student categories. The amount of the surcharge levied in one
15 academic year shall not be included in base tuition fees in the
16 next academic year. In any academic year, the total amount of
17 revenue raised through the surcharge shall not exceed fifteen
18 percent of the revenue raised through base tuition fees in that
19 academic year."

21 On page 6, beginning on line 20, after "surcharge" strike all
22 material through "category." on line 30, and insert "may vary among
23 student categories. The amount of the surcharge levied in one
24 academic year shall not be included in base tuition fees in the
25 next academic year. In any academic year, the total amount of
26 revenue raised through the surcharge shall not exceed fifteen
27 percent of the revenue raised through base tuition fees in that
28 academic year."

30 On page 8, beginning on line 3, after "among colleges" strike
31 all material through "percent." on line 9, and insert "and among

1 student categories. In any academic year, the total amount of
2 revenue raised through the surcharge shall not exceed fifteen
3 percent of the revenue raised through base tuition fees in that
4 academic year."

EFFECT: Language is removed that limits tuition surcharges annually to a maximum of ten percent for resident undergraduates, twenty percent for resident graduate and first professional students and thirty percent for nonresident students. Instead, a limit is placed on the amount of revenue that may be raised through a tuition surcharge. That limit is fifteen percent of total tuition fees revenues in an academic year. The surcharge may vary by student category.
