- 9 (1) Any retired teacher <u>or retired administrator</u> who enters service 10 in any public educational institution in Washington state shall cease 11 to receive pension payments while engaged in such service: PROVIDED, 12 That service may be rendered up to seventy-five days per school year 13 without reduction of pension.
- (2) In addition to the seventy-five days of service permitted under subsection (1) of this section, a retired teacher or retired administrator may also serve only as a substitute teacher for up to an additional fifteen days per school year without reduction of pension if:
- (a) A school district, which is not a member of a multidistrict 19 20 substitute cooperative, determines that it has exhausted or can 21 reasonably anticipate that it will exhaust its list of qualified and 22 available substitutes and the school board of the district adopts a 23 resolution to make its substitute teachers who are retired teachers or retired administrators eligible for the additional fifteen days of 24 25 extended service once the list of qualified and available substitutes has been exhausted. The resolution by the school district shall state 26 27 that the services of retired teachers and retired administrators are necessary to address the shortage of qualified and available 28 substitutes. The resolution shall be valid only for the school year in 29 30 which it is adopted. The district shall forward a copy of the resolution with a list of retired teachers and retired administrators 31 32 who have been employed as substitute teachers to the department and may notify the retired teachers and retired administrators included on the 33 34 list of their right to take advantage of the provisions of this subsection; or 35
- 36 (b) A multidistrict substitute cooperative determines that the

school districts have exhausted or can reasonably anticipate that they 1 will exhaust their list of qualified and available substitutes and each 2 of the school boards adopts a resolution to make their substitute 3 teachers or retired administrators who are retired teachers eligible 4 for the extended service once the list of qualified and available 5 substitutes has been exhausted. The resolutions by each of the school 6 7 districts shall state that the services of retired teachers and retired 8 administrators are necessary to address the shortage of qualified and 9 available substitutes. The resolutions shall be valid only for the 10 school year in which they are adopted. The cooperative shall forward a copy of the resolutions with a list of retired teachers and retired 11 administrators who have been employed as substitute teachers to the 12 13 and may notify the retired teachers and retired department administrators included on the list of their right to take advantage of 14 15 the provisions of this subsection.

(3) In addition to the seventy-five days of service permitted under subsection (1) of this section, a retired administrator may also serve as a substitute administrator up to an additional fifteen days per school year without reduction of pension if a school district board of directors adopts a resolution declaring that the services of a retired administrator or retired teacher are necessary because it cannot find a replacement administrator to fill a vacancy. The resolution shall be valid only for the school year in which it is adopted. The district shall forward a copy of the resolution with the name of the retired administrator or retired teacher who has been employed as a substitute administrator to the department. However, a retired administrator may not serve more than a total of fifteen additional days per school year pursuant to subsections (2) and (3) of this section.
