14 College in the amount of \$3,000,000, plus financing expenses and
15 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW, for construction of a
16 \$4,000,000 work force and vocational training facility. Columbia Basin
17 College shall provide the balance of project cost in local funds;
18 ((and))

19 (x) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Shoreline
20 Community College in the amount of \$400,000, plus financing expenses
21 and reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW, for construction of a
22 \$3,500,000 vocational art facility. The balance of construction funds
23 are appropriated in the capital budget;

24 (y) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Whatcom Community
25 College in the amount of \$800,000 plus financing expenses and reserves
26 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to develop a new \$2,240,000, 13,000
27 square foot childcare center. The balance of project cost shall be a
28 combination of local capital funds and nonstate funds provided through
29 private gifts or contributions;

30 (z) Enter into a contract on behalf of Centralia College in the
31 amount of \$2,500 to purchase approximately 1.5 acres in Morton to
32 establish a permanent East County Center site;

33 (aa) Enter into a contract on behalf of Centralia College in the
34 amount of \$70,000 to purchase approximately 0.25 acres using local
35 funds. The property is between two parcels owned by the college in
36 Centralia and shall be used to expand parking for the Business Resource
37 Center and Daycare;

38 (bb) Enter into financial contracts on behalf of Centralia College
39 in the amount of \$400,000 to purchase older residential homes and lots

1 adjacent to the main campus using local funds or real estate contracts.
2 Property acquisition shall be consistent with the college's master plan
3 and will provide for future expansion of continuing education,
4 community outreach, student services, and parking;

5 (cc) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Pierce College in
6 the amount of \$523,000 plus financing expenses and reserves pursuant to
7 chapter 39.94 RCW to develop a new \$1,500,000, 12,000 square foot
8 classroom building on the Lakewood campus. The balance of project cost
9 shall be provided through a combination of local capital funds and
10 existing minor works appropriation to replace 2 of 7 portable
11 classrooms that are at the end of their useful lives;

12 (dd) Enter into a contract on behalf of Green River Community
13 College in the amount of \$100,000 to purchase the 8.97 acre Lea Hill
14 Park, adjoining the main campus, from King county using local funds;
15 and

16 (ee) Enter into a contract on behalf of Spokane Falls Community
17 College to purchase an existing 4,640 square foot structure and 13,900
18 square foot lot for \$100,000 using local funds. The facility shall be
19 used for a comprehensive early head start program administered under a
20 United States Department of Health and Human Services grant awarded to
21 the community colleges of Spokane.

22 (5) State parks and recreation commission:

23 Enter into a financing contract on behalf of the state parks and
24 recreation commission in the amount of \$600,000 and reserves pursuant
25 to chapter 39.94 RCW, to develop new campsite electrical hookups and
26 expand ((group camp facilities statewide)) or enhance revenue
27 generating facilities state-wide.

28 (6) Washington State University:

29 (a) Enter into a financing contract for \$8,600,000 plus financing
30 costs to construct a facility on the Vancouver Branch Campus. The
31 facility will be leased to the federal general services administration
32 to house the Cascades Volcano Observatory and the lease payments shall
33 reimburse Washington State University for the cost of the financing
34 contract; and

35 (b) Enter into a financing contract for \$7,500,000 plus financing
36 costs to construct a portion of the Consolidated Information Center at
37 the Tri-Cities Branch Campus. Washington State University will be
38 reimbursed for the cost of the financing contract from federal money
39 received for the operation and/or construction of the center.

1 (7) Western Washington State University:

2 Lease-purchase property adjacent or near to the campus for future
3 expansion for \$2,000,000.

4 (8) Washington state fruit commission:

5 Enter into a financing contract for the purpose of completing its
6 new headquarters and visitor center facility in the principal amount of
7 \$300,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to
8 chapter 39.94 RCW.

9 (9) The office of the state treasurer is authorized to enter into
10 a financing contract pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW for \$4,000,000 plus
11 issuance expenses and required reserves to assist a consortium of
12 Washington counties in the lease/purchase of leasehold improvements to
13 Martin Hall, on the campus of eastern state hospital, in Medical Lake,
14 and the renovation of the hall for use as a juvenile rehabilitation
15 center. The participating counties shall be primarily and directly
16 liable for the payments under the financing contract for the project
17 and the office of the state treasurer shall be limited to a contingent
18 obligation under the financing contract. In the event of any
19 deficiency of payments by any of the participating counties under the
20 financing contract, the office of the state treasurer is directed to
21 withdraw from that county's share of state revenues for distribution an
22 amount sufficient to fulfill the terms and conditions of the contract
23 authorized under this subsection.

24 (10) Washington state convention and trade center:

25 (a) Enter into a financing contract in the amount of \$8,000,000,
26 plus financing expenses and reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW, for
27 refinancing the parking revenue note issued by the corporation to
28 Industrial Indemnity Corporation and held by its successor, Resolution
29 Credit Service Corporation; and

30 (b) Enter into a financing contract in the amount of \$111,700,000,
31 plus financing expenses and reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW, for
32 the construction of a \$130,000,000 expansion of the Washington state
33 convention and trade center as authorized under chapter 386, Laws of
34 1995 in lieu of bonds described therein. The balance of the expansion
35 project funds shall be provided from interest earnings and public or
36 private funds.

37 (11) Washington state patrol:

38 Enter into a long-term ground lease with a consortium including,
39 but not limited to, Boeing Company and the Port of Seattle for the

1 purpose of constructing an aircraft rescue and aircraft fire fighting
2 training facility at the Fire Training Academy near North Bend. The
3 facility shall be financed through contributions from consortium
4 members and a grant from the Federal Aviation Administration which
5 requires annual training for all public and private airport fire
6 fighters. No state appropriations are provided.

7 NEW SECTION. Sec. 43. A new section is added to 1995 2nd sp.s. c
8 16 (uncodified) to read as follows:

9 The provision of social and health services by a private nonprofit
10 corporation operating in any county containing a population greater
11 than forty thousand and less than ninety thousand people for an
12 extended period of time constitutes consideration by the private
13 nonprofit corporation for acquiring property or property interests
14 owned by a county, which property or property interests were acquired
15 in whole or in part from money appropriated and authorized by chapter
16 43.83D RCW, if the property will be used for the provision of the
17 social and health services.

18 **Sec. 44.** RCW 43.155.050 and 1995 2nd sp.s. c 18 s 918 and 1995 c
19 376 s 11 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

20 The public works assistance account is hereby established in the
21 state treasury. Money may be placed in the public works assistance
22 account from the proceeds of bonds when authorized by the legislature
23 or from any other lawful source. Money in the public works assistance
24 account shall be used to make loans and to give financial guarantees to
25 local governments for public works projects. Moneys in the account may
26 also be appropriated to provide for state match requirements under
27 federal law for projects and activities conducted and financed by the
28 board under the drinking water assistance account. During the 1995-97
29 fiscal biennium, moneys in the public works assistance account may be
30 appropriated for (~~transfer to the flood control assistance account to~~
31 ~~be used for~~) flood control and repair assistance, including (~~grants~~)
32 transfer to the flood control assistance account program under chapter
33 86.26 RCW. To the extent that moneys in the public works assistance
34 account are not appropriated during the 1995-97 fiscal biennium for
35 public works or flood control assistance, the legislature may direct
36 their transfer to the state general fund. In awarding grants under
37 chapter 86.26 RCW, the department of ecology shall give strong

1 preference to local governments that have: (1) Implemented, or are in
2 the process of implementing, an ordinance that establishes a flood
3 plain policy that is substantially more stringent than minimum federal
4 requirements; (2) completed a comprehensive flood control plan meeting
5 the requirements of RCW 86.12.200; or (3) constructed, or are in the
6 process of constructing, a system of overtopping dikes or levees that
7 allow public access.

8 **Sec. 45.** RCW 43.155.065 and 1990 c 133 s 7 are each amended to
9 read as follows:

10 The board may make low-interest or interest-free loans to local
11 governments for emergency public works projects. Emergency public
12 works projects shall include the construction, repair, reconstruction,
13 replacement, rehabilitation, or improvement of a public water system
14 that is in violation of health and safety standards and is being
15 operated by a local government on a temporary basis. During the
16 1995-97 fiscal biennium, emergency projects shall also include repair,
17 reconstruction, or replacement of streets, roads, bridges, water
18 systems, storm water systems, sanitary sewage systems, and flood
19 control facilities and structures damaged during the November 1995,
20 December 1995, and February 1996 storm and flood incidents. The loans
21 may be used to help fund all or part of an emergency public works
22 project less any reimbursement from any of the following sources: (1)
23 Federal disaster or emergency funds, including funds from the federal
24 emergency management agency; (2) state disaster or emergency funds; (3)
25 insurance settlements; or (4) litigation. Emergency loans may be made
26 only from those funds specifically appropriated from the public works
27 assistance account for such purpose by the legislature. The amount
28 appropriated from the public works assistance account for emergency
29 loan purposes shall not exceed five percent of the total amount
30 appropriated from this account in any biennium, except that during the
31 1995-97 fiscal biennium, the amount shall not exceed ten percent.

32 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 46.** This act is necessary for the immediate
33 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
34 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
35 effect immediately.
