- 5 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the
- 6 following:
- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the management
- 8 of Puget Sound crab involves a wide variety of management tools and
- 9 that it is becoming increasingly more difficult to balance the needs of
- 10 recreational and commercial crab fishers.
- 11 The legislature finds that the Puget Sound commercial crab industry
- 12 experienced an unexpected season closure during the 1995 fishing season
- 13 and that the closure has had an adverse impact on the markets developed
- 14 by these fishers. The legislature also finds that Puget Sound provides
- 15 a unique opportunity to fish recreationally for crabs.
- It is the intent of the legislature to establish a process to
- 17 provide adequate notice to fishers in the Puget Sound commercial crab
- 18 fishery of unexpected closures. It is not the intent of the
- 19 legislature to limit the ability of the fish and wildlife commission to
- 20 manage Puget Sound crab for the benefit of all of its citizens nor is
- 21 it the intent of the legislature to intercede in the commission's
- 22 allocation of the Puget Sound crab fishery.
- 23 **Sec. 2.** RCW 75.28.046 and 1994 c 260 s 12 are each amended to read
- 24 as follows:
- This section applies to all commercial fishery licenses, delivery
- 26 licenses, and charter licenses, except for whiting« Puget Sound fishery
- 27 licenses and emergency salmon delivery licenses.
- 28 (1) The license holder may engage in the activity authorized by a
- 29 license subject to this section. With the exception of Dungeness crab«
- 30 coastal fishery class B licensees licensed under RCW
- 31 $75.30.350((\frac{3}{3}))(4)$, the holder of a license subject to this section
- 32 may also designate up to two alternate operators for the license.
- 33 Dungeness crab« coastal fishery class B licensees may not designate
- 34 alternate operators. A person designated as an alternate operator must

- 1 possess an alternate operator license issued under (($\frac{1}{2}$) of this
- 2 act and)) RCW 75.28.048.
- 3 (2) The fee to change the alternate operator designation is 4 twenty-two dollars.
- 5 **Sec. 3.** RCW 75.28.048 and 1993 c 340 s 25 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 (1) A person who holds a commercial fishery license, delivery
- 8 license, or charter license may operate the vessel designated on the
- 9 license. A person who is not the license holder may operate the vessel
- 10 designated on the license only if:
- 11 (a) The person holds an alternate operator license issued by the
- 12 director; and
- 13 (b) The person is designated as an alternate operator on the
- 14 underlying commercial fishery license, delivery license, or charter
- 15 license under RCW 75.28.046.
- 16 (2) Only an individual at least sixteen years of age may hold an
- 17 alternate operator license.
- 18 (3) No individual may hold more than one alternate operator
- 19 license. An individual who holds an alternate operator license may be
- 20 designated as an alternate operator on an unlimited number of
- 21 commercial fishery licenses, delivery licenses, and charter licenses
- 22 under RCW 75.28.046.
- 23 (4) An individual who holds two Dungeness crab« Puget Sound fishery
- 24 licenses or two persons who both hold Dungeness crab« Puget Sound
- 25 <u>fishery licenses may operate one vessel, provided that the owner or</u>
- 26 alternate operator is on the vessel.
- 27 (5) As used in this section, to "operate" means to control the
- 28 deployment or removal of fishing gear from state waters while aboard a
- 29 vessel, to operate a vessel as a charter boat, or to operate a vessel
- 30 delivering food fish or shellfish taken in offshore waters to a port
- 31 within the state.
- 32 **Sec. 4.** RCW 75.28.130 and 1994 c 260 s 14 are each amended to read
- 33 as follows:
- 34 (1) This section establishes commercial fishery licenses required
- 35 for shellfish fisheries and the annual fees for those licenses. The
- 36 director may issue a limited-entry commercial fishery license only to

1 a person who meets the qualifications established in applicable 2 governing sections of this title.

(2)(a) The fish and wildlife commission may open the commercial Dungeness crabx Puget Sound fishery from October 1 to April 15. If the commission closes or does not open the commercial Dungeness crabx Puget Sound fishery at all between October 1 and April 15, the commission

- shall hold a public hearing in the north Puget Sound area before the 1 closure. The fish and wildlife commission shall consider the effect of 2 a potential fishery closure upon the marketability of crab and the 3 4 economic health and the physical safety of the fishers. The fish and wildlife commission may close the commercial Dungeness crab« Puget Sound 5 non-Indian fishery between October 1 and April 15 only with the 6 7 approval of a majority of fish and wildlife commission members. In the 8 event of a closure, the fish and wildlife commission shall close the 9 commercial Dungeness crab« Puget Sound fishery in a way that the fishers have adequate time to remove their pots from the fishing grounds, 10 considering weather conditions and the size and capacity of the boats 11 participating in the fishery. It is unlawful to set crab gear prior to 12 13 9:00 a.m. on the opening day of the season.
- 14 <u>(b) The holder of a Dungeness crab* Puget Sound fishery license may</u>
 15 <u>take or fish for crabs with up to one hundred shellfish pots.</u>
- 16 (c) The fish and wildlife commission shall work with the treaty
 17 Indian commercial crab fishing industry to ensure coordination with the
 18 non-Indian commercial crab fishing industry, to minimize waste, and to
 19 ensure the long-term health and productivity of the resource.
- (3) The ((director)) fish and wildlife commission may by rule 20 determine the species of shellfish that may be taken with the 21 commercial fishery licenses established in this section, the gear that 22 may be used with the licenses, and the areas or waters in which the 23 24 licenses may be used. Where a fishery license has been established for 25 a particular species, gear, geographical area, or combination thereof, 26 a more general fishery license may not be used to take shellfish in 27 that fishery.
- 28 **Sec. 5.** RCW 75.30.130 and 1993 c 340 s 34 are each amended to read 29 as follows:
- (1) It is unlawful to take <u>Dungeness</u> crab (Cancer magister) in Puget Sound without first obtaining a <u>Dungeness</u> crab Puget Sound fishery license. As used in this section, "Puget Sound" has the meaning given in RCW 75.28.110(5)(a). A <u>Dungeness</u> crab Puget Sound fishery license is not required to take other species of crab, including red rock crab (Cancer productus).
- 36 (2) Except as provided in subsection((s)) (3) ((and (7))) of this 37 section, after January 1, 1982, the director shall issue no new

- Dungeness crab* Puget Sound fishery licenses. ((Only)) A person ((who meets the following qualifications)) may renew an existing license((÷ (a))) if the person ((shall have)) has held the Dungeness crab* Puget Sound fishery license sought to be renewed during the previous year or acquired the license by transfer from someone who held it during the previous year, and ((shall)) has not ((have)) subsequently transferred the license to another person((; and
 - (b) The person shall document, by valid shellfish receiving tickets issued by the department, that one thousand pounds of dungeness crab were caught and sold during the previous two-year period ending on December 31st of an odd-numbered year:
- 12 (i) Under the license sought to be renewed; or
- (ii) Under any combination of the following commercial fishery
 licenses that the person held when the crab were caught and sold: Crab
 pot—Non-Puget Sound, crab ring net—Non-Puget Sound, dungeness crab—
 Puget Sound. Sales under a license other than the one sought to be
 renewed may be used for the renewal of no more than one dungeness
 crab—Puget Sound fishery license)).
- 19 (3) Where the person failed to obtain the license during the 20 previous year because of a license suspension, the person may qualify 21 for a license by establishing that the person held such a license 22 during the last year in which the license was not suspended.
 - (4) ((The director may reduce or waive the poundage requirement established under subsection (2)(b) of this section upon the recommendation of a review board established under RCW 75.30.050. The review board may recommend a reduction or waiver of the poundage requirement in individual cases if, in the board's judgment, extenuating circumstances prevent achievement of the poundage requirement. The director shall adopt rules governing the operation of the review boards and defining "extenuating circumstances."
- 31 (5)) This section does not restrict the issuance of commercial 32 crab licenses for areas other than Puget Sound or for species other 33 than <u>Dungeness</u> crab.
- (((6) Subject to the restrictions in section 11 of this act,)) (5)

 Dungeness crab« Puget Sound fishery licenses are transferable from one license holder to another.
- (((7) If fewer than two hundred persons are eligible for <u>Dungeness</u> crab* Puget Sound fishery licenses, the director may accept applications for new licenses. The director shall determine by random selection the

- 8 **Sec. 6.** RCW 75.28.045 and 1993 c 340 s 7 are each amended to read 9 as follows:
- This section applies to all commercial fishery licenses, delivery licenses, and charter licenses.
- 12 (1) An applicant for a license subject to this section may 13 designate a vessel to be used with the license. Except for emergency 14 salmon delivery licenses, the director may issue a license regardless 15 of whether the applicant designates a vessel. An applicant may 16 designate no more than one vessel on a license subject to this section.
- (2) A license for a fishery that requires a vessel authorizes no 18 taking or delivery of food fish or shellfish unless a vessel is 19 designated on the license. A delivery license authorizes no delivery 20 of food fish or shellfish unless a vessel is designated on the license.
- 21 (3) It is unlawful to take food fish or shellfish in a fishery that 22 requires a vessel except from a vessel designated on a commercial 23 fishery license for that fishery.
- 24 (4) It is unlawful to operate a vessel as a charter boat unless the 25 vessel is designated on a charter license.
- (5) No vessel may be designated on more than one commercial fishery license unless the licenses are for different fisheries, except as otherwise provided in statute. No vessel may be designated on more than one delivery license, or more than one salmon charter license, or
