- 5 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 6 following:
- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The citizens of Washington should enjoy a
- 8 high quality of life, which requires a healthy state economy. To
- 9 achieve this goal, the legislature recognizes that the state must be
- 10 able to compete economically at a national and international level. It
- 11 is critical to the economic well-being of the citizens of this state
- 12 that the legislature strive to continually improve the state's economic
- 13 climate. Therefore, the legislature intends to provide a mechanism
- 14 whereby the information necessary to achieve this goal is available on
- 15 a timely and reliable basis.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) The economic climate council is hereby created.
- 18 (2) The council shall select a series of no more than ten
- 19 benchmarks that characterize the competitive environment of the state.
- 20 The benchmarks should be indicators of the cost of doing business; the
- 21 education and skills of the work force; a sound infrastructure; and the
- 22 quality of life. In selecting the appropriate benchmarks, the council
- 23 shall use the following criteria:
- 24 (a) The availability of comparative information for other states
- 25 and countries;
- 26 (b) The timeliness with which benchmark information can be
- 27 obtained; and
- 28 (c) The accuracy and validity of the benchmarks in measuring the
- 29 economic climate indicators named in this section.
- The council shall report to the governor and the fiscal committees
- 31 of the senate and the house of representatives by September 30, 1996,
- 32 on the benchmarks selected under this subsection (2).
- 33 (3) Periodically each year the council shall prepare an official
- 34 state economic climate report on the present status of benchmarks,
- 35 changes in the benchmarks since the previous report, and the reasons

- for the changes. The reports shall include current benchmark comparisons with other states and countries, and an analysis of factors related to the benchmarks that may affect the ability of the state to compete economically at the national and international level.
- 5 (4) The council shall periodically submit reports prepared under 6 this section to the governor and the fiscal committees of the senate 7 and the house of representatives. The first report shall be made by 8 September 30, 1996.
- 9 (5) All agencies of state government shall provide to the council 10 immediate access to all information relating to economic climate 11 reports.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) Until July 1, 1997, the economic and revenue forecast council shall, in addition to its other duties and responsibilities, function as the economic climate council created under section 2 of this act.
- 16 (2) The staff of the economic and revenue forecast council shall 17 serve as staff to the economic climate council until July 1, 1997.
- 18 (3) By September 30, 1996, the council shall make recommendations 19 to the legislature regarding: (a) Permanent composition of the 20 economic climate council, including the procedures for appointment of 21 members, length of terms, selection of a chair, and reimbursement for 22 expenses or other compensation; and (b) a permanent staffing structure 23 to support the work of the economic climate council.
- 24 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. (1) The economic climate council shall create an advisory committee to assist the council in selecting 25 benchmarks and developing economic climate reports and benchmarks. The 26 27 advisory committee shall provide for a process to ensure public 28 participation in the selection of the benchmarks. The advisory 29 committee shall consist of no more than seven members. At least two of the members of the advisory committee shall have experience in and 30 represent business, and at least two of the members shall have 31 32 experience in and represent labor. All of the members of the advisory committee shall have special expertise and interest in the state's 33 economic climate and competitive strategies. Appointments to the 34 35 advisory committee shall be recommended by the chair of the council and 36 approved by a two-thirds vote of the council. The chair of the advisory committee shall be selected by the members of the committee. 37

- 1 (2) The advisory committee shall meet as determined by the chair of 2 the committee until September 30, 1996, and shall meet at least twice 3 per year thereafter in advance of the economic climate reports.
- 4 (3) Members of the advisory council shall serve without 5 compensation but shall be reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance 6 with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060 while attending meetings of the 7 advisory committee, sessions of the economic climate council, or on 8 official business authorized by the council.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** Sections 1, 2, and 4 of this act shall 10 constitute a new chapter in Title 82 RCW."
