- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 28B.15 8 RCW to read as follows:
- 9 (1) The governing board of each of the state universities, the 10 regional universities, and The Evergreen State College, upon the written agreement of its respective student government association or 11 12 its equivalent, may establish and charge each enrolled student a 13 technology fee, separate from tuition fees. During the 1996-97 academic year, any technology fee shall not exceed one hundred twenty 14 15 dollars for a full-time student. Any technology fee charged to a part-16 time student shall be calculated as a pro rata share of the fee charged to a full-time student. 17
- 18 (2) Revenue from this fee shall be used exclusively for technology 19 resources for general student use.
- 20 (3) Only changes in the amount of the student technology fee agreed 21 upon by both the governing board and its respective student government 22 association or its equivalent shall be used to adjust the amount 23 charged to students. Changes in the amount charged to students, once 24 implemented, become the basis for future changes.
- (4) Annually, the student government association or its equivalent may abolish the fee by a majority vote. In the event of such a vote, the student government association or its equivalent shall notify the governing board of the institution. The fee shall cease being collected the term after the student government association or its equivalent voted to eliminate the fee.
- 31 (5) The student government association or its equivalent shall 32 approve the annual expenditure plan for the fee revenue.
- 33 (6) The universities and The Evergreen State College shall deposit 34 three and one-half percent of revenues from the technology fee into the 35 institutional financial aid fund under RCW 28B.15.820.

- 1 (7) As used in this section, "technology fee" is a fee charged to 2 students to recover, in whole or in part, the costs of providing and 3 maintaining services to students that include, but need not be limited 4 to: Access to the internet and world wide web, e-mail, computer and 5 multimedia work stations and laboratories, computer software, and dial-6 up telephone services.
- 7 (8) Prior to the establishment of a technology fee, a governing 8 board shall provide to the student governing body a list of existing 9 fees of a similar nature or for a similar purpose. The board and the 10 student governing body shall ensure that student fees for technology 11 are not duplicative.

## 12 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.15.031 and 1995 1st sp.s. c 9 s 2 are each amended 13 to read as follows:

14 The term "operating fees" as used in this chapter shall include the 15 fees, other than building fees, charged all students registering at the state's colleges and universities but shall not include fees for short 16 courses, self-supporting degree credit programs and courses, marine 17 18 station work, experimental station work, correspondence or extension 19 courses, and individual instruction and student deposits or rentals, disciplinary and library fines, which colleges and universities shall 20 have the right to impose, laboratory, gymnasium, health, technology and 21 student activity fees, or fees, charges, rentals, and other income 22 23 derived from any or all revenue producing lands, buildings and 24 facilities of the colleges or universities heretofore or hereafter 25 acquired, constructed or installed, including but not limited to income from rooms, dormitories, dining rooms, hospitals, infirmaries, housing 26 or student activity buildings, vehicular parking facilities, land, or 27 the appurtenances thereon, or such other special fees as may be 28 29 established by any college or university board of trustees or regents 30 from time to time. All moneys received as operating fees at any institution of higher education shall be deposited in a local account 31 32 containing only operating fees revenue and related interest: PROVIDED, 33 That a minimum of three and one-half percent of operating fees shall be 34 retained by the institutions, except the technical colleges, for the purposes of RCW 28B.15.820. Local operating fee accounts shall not be 35 36 subject to appropriation by the legislature or allotment procedures 37 under chapter 43.88 RCW.

1 Sec. 3. RCW 28B.15.615 and 1993 sp.s. c 18 s 23 are each amended 2 to read as follows:

3 Subject to the limitations of RCW 28B.15.910, the governing boards 4 of the state universities and the regional universities may exempt the following students from paying all or a portion of the resident 5 operating fee <u>and the technology fee</u>: Students granted a graduate 6 service appointment, designated as such by the institution, involving 7 not less than twenty hours of work per week. The exemption shall be 8 9 for the term of the appointment. ((The stipend paid to persons holding 10 graduate student appointments from nonstate funds shall be reduced and the institution reimbursed from such funds in an amount equal to the 11 resident operating fee which funds shall be transmitted to the general 12 13 fund.))

NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take effect immediately."
