  - (e) Parent support groups; and
- 31 (f) Service coordination for individual families, and assistance 32 with accessing services, provided in a manner that ensures that 33 individual families have only one individual or agency to which they 34 look for service coordination. Where appropriate for a family, service 35 coordination may be conducted through interdisciplinary or interagency 36 teams.
- These programs are intended to be voluntary for the parents
