7 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The state makes a substantial investment of
8 finances and resources in students who are attending state institutions
9 of higher education. In exchange, students are expected to actively
10 pursue their education and contribute to an academic environment that
11 is conducive to learning. Students who abuse liquor and drugs,
12 however, are unable to make full use of this educational opportunity.
13 More important, students who abuse liquor and drugs create an
14 environment that interferes with the ability of other students to
15 pursue their education. This is especially true in university-owned
16 student housing where liquor and drug abuse contribute to noise,
17 vandalism, theft, and violence. While the universities and colleges
18 may not be able to stop all liquor and drug abuse among student
19 populations, the very least they can do is ensure that the vast
20 majority of students without drug or liquor problems are provided with
21 a living environment that is safe and conducive to the pursuit of
22 higher education.

23 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.10 RCW
24 to read as follows:

25 (1) Each public institution of higher education shall notify all
26 students applying for college or university-owned student housing of
27 the availability of housing in an area in which all liquor use is
28 prohibited.

29 (2) Each public institution of higher education, upon request,
30 shall provide students access to student housing on a residence hall
31 floor, designated area, or in a building where liquor use is
32 prohibited.

33 (3) Each public institution shall have in place, and distribute to
34 students in college or university-owned student housing, a process for
35 reporting violations and complaints of liquor and illegal drug use.

1 (4) Each public institution shall have in place, distribute to
2 students, and vigorously enforce policies and procedures for
3 investigating complaints regarding liquor and illegal drug use in
4 college or university-owned student housing, including the sanctions
5 that may be applied for violations of the institution's liquor and
6 illegal drug use policies.

7 (5) Students who violate the institution's liquor and illegal drug
8 use policies are subject to disciplinary action. Sanctions that may be
9 applied for violations of the institution's liquor or illegal drug use
10 policies include warnings, restitution for property damage, probation,
11 expulsion from college or university-owned housing, and suspension from
12 the institution.

13 (6) As used in this section:

14 (a) "Liquor" has the meaning in RCW 66.04.010; and

15 (b) "Illegal drug use" refers to the unlawful use of controlled
16 substances under chapter 69.50 RCW or legend drugs under chapter 69.41
17 RCW.

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** By December 1, 1996, each institution of
19 higher education that has state-owned college or university student
20 housing shall report to the house of representatives and senate higher
21 education committees of the legislature on the following:

22 (1) Policies governing liquor and illegal drug use and abuse in
23 college and university-owned student housing;

24 (2) Aggregate information on reported violations and actions taken
25 to address those violations;

26 (3) Efforts taken by institutions to prevent the use of, and
27 educate students on the effect of, liquor and illegal drugs; and

28 (4) Copies of the drug free schools and community act biennial
29 review required by the secretary of education, United States department
30 of education."

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34 On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "residences;" strike the
35 remainder of the title and insert "adding a new section to chapter

1 28B.10 RCW; creating new sections; and prescribing penalties."

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
