The legislature finds that frail elders and vulnerable adults may 8 be subjected to abuse, neglect, exploitation, or abandonment. 9 The legislature finds that there are a number of adults ((sixty years of 10 age or older)) who lack the ability to perform or obtain those services 11 12 necessary to maintain or establish their well-being. The legislature finds that many frail elders and vulnerable adults have health problems 13 that place them in a dependent position. The legislature further finds 14 15 that a significant number of frail elders and vulnerable adults have 16 mental and verbal limitations that leave them vulnerable and incapable 17 of asking for help and protection.

It is the intent of the legislature to prevent or remedy the abuse, neglect, exploitation, or abandonment of persons sixty years of age or older who have a functional, mental, or physical inability to care for or protect themselves.

It is the intent of the legislature to assist frail elders and vulnerable adults by providing these persons with the protection of the courts and with the least-restrictive services, such as home care, and by preventing or reducing inappropriate institutional care. The legislature finds that it is in the interests of the public health, safety, and welfare of the people of the state to provide a procedure for identifying these vulnerable persons and providing the services and remedies necessary for their well-being.

The legislature finds that <u>frail elders and</u> vulnerable adults( $(\tau)$ ) who are ((<del>physically or emotionally</del>)) abused, <u>neglected</u>, <u>abandoned</u>, or ((<del>financially</del>)) exploited may need the protection of the courts. The legislature further finds that many of these elderly <u>or vulnerable</u>

- (1) In addition to other remedies available under the law, a frail 6 7 elder or vulnerable adult or a person age eighteen or older who has been subjected to abuse, neglect, exploitation, or abandonment either 8 9 while residing in a long-term care facility or in the case of a person 10 in the care of a home health, hospice, or home care agency, residing at 11 home, shall have a cause of action for damages on account of his or her 12 injuries, pain and suffering, and loss of property sustained thereby. This action shall be available where the defendant is or was a 13 14 corporation, trust, unincorporated association, partnership, 15 administrator, employee, agent, officer, partner, or director of a long-term care facility, such as a nursing home or boarding home, that 16 is licensed or required to be licensed under chapter 18.20, 18.51, 17 18 72.36, or 70.128 RCW, or of a home health, hospice, or home care agency 19 licensed or required to be licensed under chapter 70.127 RCW, as now or
- (2) In an action brought under this section, a prevailing plaintiff 21 22 shall be awarded his or her actual damages, together with the costs of 23 the suit, including a reasonable attorney's fee, and the court may in 24 its discretion increase the award of damages to an amount not to exceed 25 three times the actual damages sustained. However, such increased damages award may not exceed ten thousand dollars. The term "costs" 26 includes, but is not limited to, the reasonable fees for a quardian, 27 guardian ad litem, and experts, if any, that may be necessary to the 28 29 litigation of a claim brought under this section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 57. A new section is added to chapter 74.34 RCW to read as follows:
- A petition for an order for protection or an action for damages under this chapter may be brought by the plaintiff, or where necessary, by his or her family members and/or guardian or legal fiduciary, or as otherwise provided under this chapter. The death of the plaintiff shall not deprive the court of jurisdiction over a petition or claim brought under this chapter. Upon petition, after the death of the
