5 On page 2, line 14, after "chapter." insert "However, the legislature recognizes that the mandatory disclosure of the HIV status 6 7 of individual offenders may cause some corrections and jail staff to use more precautions with those offenders and detained people they know 8 to be HIV positive. The legislature also recognizes the risk exists 9 that some corrections and jail staff may correspondingly use fewer 10 11 precautions with those offenders and detained people they are not informed are HIV positive. The legislature finds, however, that the 12 13 system of universal precautions required under federal and state law in all settings where risk of occupational exposure to communicable 14 diseases exists remains the most effective way to reduce the risk of 15 communicable disease transmission. The legislature does not intend to 16 discourage the use of universal precautions but to provide supplemental 17 information for corrections and jail staff to utilize as part of their 18 universal precautions with all offenders and detained people." 19

Use of this information for any other purpose, including harassment or discrimination, may result in disciplinary action, in addition to the penalties prescribed in RCW 70.24.080 or any other penalties as may be prescribed by law."

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
