7 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 2.68 RCW
8 to read as follows:

9 The supreme court, the court of appeals and all superior and
10 district courts, through the judicial information system committee,
11 shall:

12 (1) Continue to plan for and implement processes for making
13 judicial information available electronically;

14 (2) Promote and facilitate electronic access to the public of
15 judicial information and services;

16 (3) Establish technical standards for such services;

17 (4) Consider electronic public access needs when planning new
18 information systems or major upgrades of information systems;

19 (5) Develop processes to determine which judicial information the
20 public most wants and needs;

21 (6) Increase capabilities to receive information electronically
22 from the public and transmit forms, applications and other
23 communications and transactions electronically;

24 (7) Use technologies that allow continuous access twenty-four hours
25 a day, seven days per week, involve little or no cost to access, and
26 are capable of being used by persons without extensive technology
27 ability; and

28 (8) Consider and incorporate wherever possible ease of access to
29 electronic technologies by persons with disabilities.

30 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 44.68 RCW
31 to read as follows:

32 The legislature and legislative agencies through the joint
33 legislative systems committee, shall:

- 1 (1)Continue to plan for and implement processes for making
2 legislative information available electronically;
- 3 (2) Promote and facilitate electronic access to the public of
4 legislative information and services;
- 5 (3) Establish technical standards for such services;
- 6 (4) Consider electronic public access needs when planning new
7 information systems or major upgrades of information systems;
- 8 (5) Develop processes to determine which legislative information
9 the public most wants and needs;
- 10 (6) Increase capabilities to receive information electronically
11 from the public and transmit forms, applications and other
12 communications and transactions electronically;
- 13 (7) Use technologies that allow continuous access twenty-four hours
14 a day, seven days per week, involve little or no cost to access, and
15 are capable of being used by persons without extensive technology
16 ability; and
- 17 (8) Consider and incorporate wherever possible ease of access to
18 electronic technologies by persons with disabilities."
