- AN ACT Relating to improvements to the enforcement provisions of the Washington state liquor act; amending RCW 66.12.120; adding a new

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 66.12.120 and 1975 1st ex.s. c 173 s 3 are each 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 Notwithstanding any other provision of Title 66 RCW, a person
- 9 twenty-one years of age or over may ((be authorized by the board to)),
- 10 free of tax and markup, for personal or household use, bring into the
- 11 state of Washington from another state no more than once per calendar
- 12 month up to two liters of spirits or wine or two hundred eighty-eight
- 13 ounces of beer. Additionally, such person may be authorized by the

- 16 this section for personal or household use only upon payment of an
