- 1 AN ACT Relating to summaries of judgments; and amending RCW 2 4.64.030.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 4.64.030 and 1994 c 185 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 The clerk shall enter all judgments in the execution docket,
- 7 subject to the direction of the court and shall specify clearly the
- 8 amount to be recovered, the relief granted, or other determination of
- 9 the action.
- 10 On the first page of each judgment which provides for the payment
- 11 of money, including judgments in rem, mandates of judgments, and
- 12 judgments on garnishments, the following shall be succinctly
- 13 summarized: The judgment creditor and the name of his or her attorney,
- 14 the judgment debtor, the amount of the judgment, the interest owed to
- 15 the date of the judgment, and the total of the taxable costs and
- 16 attorney fees, if known at the time of the entry of the judgment. If
- 17 the attorney fees and costs are not included in the judgment, they
- 18 shall be summarized in the cost bill when filed. This information is
- 19 included in the judgment to assist the county clerk in his or her

- 1 record-keeping function. The clerk may not sign or file a judgment,
- 2 and a judgment does not take effect, until the judgment has a summary
- 3 in compliance with this section. The clerk is not liable for an
- 4 incorrect summary.
