- 1 AN ACT Relating to heritage capital projects; adding a new section
- 2 to chapter 27.34 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the state of
- 5 Washington has a rich heritage in historical sites and artifacts that
- 6 have the potential to provide life-long learning opportunities for
- 7 citizens of the state. Further, the legislature finds that many of
- 8 these historical treasures are not readily accessible to citizens, and
- 9 that there is a need to create an ongoing program to support the
- 10 capital needs of heritage organizations and facilities.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 27.34 RCW
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 The Washington state historical society shall establish a
- 14 competitive process to solicit proposals for and prioritize heritage
- 15 capital projects for potential funding in the state capital budget.
- 16 The society shall adopt rules governing project eligibility and
- 17 evaluation criteria. Application for funding of specific projects may
- 18 be made to the society by local governments, public development

authorities, nonprofit corporations, tribal governments, and other entities, as determined by the society. The society, with the advice 2 of leaders in the heritage field, including but not limited to 3 representatives from the office of the secretary of state, the eastern 4 Washington state historical society, and the state office of 5 archaeology and historic preservation, shall establish a prioritized 6 list of heritage capital projects to be recommended to the governor and the legislature by September 1st of each even-numbered year, beginning 8 9 in 1996. The prioritized list shall be developed through open and 10 public meetings. The governor and the legislature shall consider the prioritized list of heritage projects as a guide for appropriating 11 funds to heritage capital projects beginning with the 1997-99 biennium 12 13 and thereafter.
