- 1 AN ACT Relating to law enforcement training; adding new sections to
- 2 chapter 43.101 RCW; creating a new section; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.101 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) The Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs shall
- 7 assemble a study group to evaluate and make recommendations to the
- 8 legislature regarding the commission mission, duties, and
- 9 administration. The commissioners of the commission shall review the
- 10 study group recommendations for acceptance or modification. The study
- 11 group shall deliver its recommendations to the legislature by January
- 12 1, 1997.
- 13 (2) The study group shall:
- 14 (a) Review and evaluate the desirability and feasibility of
- 15 providing basic law enforcement training to preemployed law enforcement
- 16 officer applicants on a tuition or fee basis;
- 17 (b) Review and evaluate the adequacy of the commission's four-
- 18 hundred-forty-hour basic law enforcement academy training program,
- 19 including general curriculum requirements;

- 1 (c) Review and evaluate the status of supervisory, management, and 2 advanced training for incumbent law enforcement officers, and the 3 desirability and feasibility of providing the officers with advanced 4 training;
- 5 (d) Review the desirability and feasibility of certification or 6 licensing of law enforcement officers;
- 7 (e) Review and evaluate the adequacy of the capital and operating 8 investments made in law enforcement training, make recommendations 9 regarding improvements, and provide documentation of the cost of 10 implementing the improvements;
- 11 (f) Review and make recommendations regarding funding sources to 12 adequately support all recommendations; and
- (g) Investigate other issues related to law enforcement training, as desired by the study group.
- 15 (3) The Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs shall assemble the study group from names provided from the following 16 17 entities or groups: One sheriff; three police chiefs; representatives from the Washington state council of police officers; 18 19 two representatives employed by the criminal justice training commission; one police psychologist; one representative from the 20 association of Washington cities; one representative from the 21 Washington association of county officials; one representative from the 22 Washington state association of counties; one representative from a 23 24 public university; one representative from a public community college; 25 and one legislator from each caucus of the senate and the house of 26 representatives, as appointed by the leaders of the caucuses.
- 27 (4) The Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs shall 28 organize and administer the study group meetings and provide the 29 necessary staff resources to meet the requests of the study group 30 members.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. If specific funding for section 1 of this act, referencing section 1 of this act by bill and section number or chapter and section number, is not provided by June 30, 1996, in the omnibus appropriations act, section 1 of this act is null and void.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 43.101 RCW to read as follows:

- The commission may provide basic law enforcement training to students who are enrolled in criminal justice courses of study at fouryear institutions of higher education, if the training is provided during the summers following the students' junior and senior years and so long as the students bear the full cost of the training.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take effect immediately.
