- 1 AN ACT Relating to studying and testing the use of credit cards in
- 2 state liquor stores; amending RCW 66.16.040 and 66.08.026; and creating
- 3 a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 66.16.040 and 1995 c 16 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 Except as otherwise provided by law, an employee in a state liquor
- 8 store or agency may sell liquor to any person of legal age to purchase
- 9 alcoholic beverages and may also sell to holders of permits such liquor
- 10 as may be purchased under such permits.
- 11 Where there may be a question of a person's right to purchase
- 12 liquor by reason of age, such person shall be required to present any
- 13 one of the following officially issued cards of identification which
- 14 shows his/her correct age and bears his/her signature and photograph:
- 15 (1) Liquor control authority card of identification of any state or
- 16 province of Canada.
- 17 (2) Driver's license, instruction permit or identification card of
- 18 any state or province of Canada, or "identicard" issued by the
- 19 Washington state department of licensing pursuant to RCW 46.20.117.

- 1 (3) United States armed forces identification card issued to active
- 2 duty, reserve, and retired personnel and the personnel's dependents.
- 3 (4) Passport.
- 4 (5) Merchant Marine identification card issued by the United States 5 Coast Guard.
- The board may adopt such regulations as it deems proper covering the acceptance of such cards of identification.
- 8 No liquor sold under this section shall be delivered until the
- 9 purchaser has paid for the liquor in cash, except as allowed under
- 10 section 2 of this act. The use of a personal credit card does not rely
- 11 upon the credit of the state as prohibited by Article VIII, section 5
- 12 of the state Constitution.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) The state liquor control board shall
- 14 allow credit card purchases in a pilot project to study and test the
- 15 use of credit cards in state liquor stores. In order to conduct the
- 16 pilot project, the board shall, by rule:
- 17 (a) Establish the criteria for selecting store test sites;
- 18 (b) Limit the pilot project to eighteen months in duration;
- 19 (c) Include no more than twenty stores;
- 20 (d) Include the use of debit cards; and
- 21 (e) Allow only nonlicensees to make credit card purchases.
- 22 (2) The board shall provide a report of the results to the
- 23 legislature by January 1, 1998.
- 24 **Sec. 3.** RCW 66.08.026 and 1983 c 160 s 2 are each amended to read
- 25 as follows:
- 26 All administrative expenses of the board incurred on and after
- 27 April 1, 1963 shall be appropriated and paid from the liquor revolving
- 28 fund. These administrative expenses shall include, but not be limited
- 29 to: The salaries and expenses of the board and its employees, the cost
- 30 of establishing, leasing, maintaining, and operating state liquor
- 31 stores and warehouses, legal services, pilot projects, annual or other
- 32 audits, and other general costs of conducting the business of the
- 33 board. The administrative expenses shall not, however, be deemed to
- 34 include costs of liquor and lottery tickets purchased, the cost of
- 35 transportation and delivery to the point of distribution, other costs
- 36 pertaining to the acquisition and receipt of liquor and lottery
- 37 tickets, packaging and repackaging of liquor, sales tax, and those

- 1 amounts distributed pursuant to RCW 66.08.180, 66.08.190, 66.08.200,
- 2 66.08.210 and 66.08.220.
