- AN ACT Relating to wildlife violations; amending RCW 77.08.010 and
- 2 77.16.020; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** It is the intent of the legislature to
- 5 clarify hunting and fishing laws in light of the decision in State v.
- 6 Bailey, 77 Wn. App. 732 (1995). The fish and wildlife commission has
- 7 the authority to establish hunting and fishing seasons. These seasons
- 8 are defined by limiting the times, manners of taking, and places or
- 9 waters for lawful hunting, fishing, or possession of game animals, game
- 10 birds, or game fish, as well as by limiting the physical
- 11 characteristics of the game animals, game birds, or game fish which may
- 12 be lawfully taken at those times, in those manners, and at those places
- 13 or waters.
- 14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 77.08.010 and 1993 sp.s. c 2 s 66 are each amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 As used in this title or rules adopted pursuant to this title,
- 17 unless the context clearly requires otherwise:
- 18 (1) "Director" means the director of fish and wildlife.

- 1 (2) "Department" means the department of fish and wildlife.
 - (3) "Commission" means the state fish and wildlife commission.
- 3 (4) "Person" means and includes an individual, a corporation, or a 4 group of two or more individuals acting with a common purpose whether 5 acting in an individual, representative, or official capacity.
- 6 (5) "Wildlife agent" means a person appointed and commissioned by 7 the director, with authority to enforce laws and rules adopted pursuant 8 to this title, and other statutes as prescribed by the legislature.
- 9 (6) "Ex officio wildlife agent" means a commissioned officer of a 10 municipal, county, state, or federal agency having as its primary function the enforcement of criminal laws in general, while the officer 11 is in the appropriate jurisdiction. The term "ex officio wildlife 12 13 agent" includes fisheries patrol officers, special agents of the national marine fisheries service, state parks commissioned officers, 14 15 United States fish and wildlife special agents, department of natural resources enforcement officers, and United States forest service 16 17 officers, while the agents and officers are within their respective 18 jurisdictions.
- 19 (7) "To hunt" and its derivatives means an effort to kill, injure, 20 capture, or harass a wild animal or wild bird.
- 21 (8) "To trap" and its derivatives means a method of hunting using 22 devices to capture wild animals or wild birds.
- 23 (9) "To fish" and its derivatives means an effort to kill, injure, 24 harass, or catch a game fish.
- (10) "Open season" means those times, manners of taking, and places or waters established by rule of the commission for the lawful hunting, fishing, or possession of game animals, game birds, or game fish that conform to the special restrictions or physical descriptions established by rule of the commission or that have otherwise been deemed legal to hunt, fish, or possess by rule of the commission.

 "Open season" includes the first and last days of the established time.
- (11) "Closed season" means all times, manners of taking, and places 32 33 or waters other than those established by rule of the commission as an 34 open season. "Closed season" also means all hunting, fishing, or 35 possession of game animals, game birds, or game fish that do not conform to the special restrictions or physical descriptions 36 37 established by rule of the commission as an open season or that have not otherwise been deemed legal to hunt, fish, or possess by rule of 38 39 the commission as an open season.

- 1 (12) "Closed area" means a place where the hunting of some species 2 of wild animals or wild birds is prohibited.
- 3 (13) "Closed waters" means all or part of a lake, river, stream, or 4 other body of water, where fishing for game fish is prohibited.
- 5 (14) "Game reserve" means a closed area where hunting for all wild 6 animals and wild birds is prohibited.
- 7 (15) "Bag limit" means the maximum number of game animals, game 8 birds, or game fish which may be taken, caught, killed, or possessed by 9 a person, as specified by rule of the commission for a particular 10 period of time, or as to size, sex, or species.
- (16) "Wildlife" means all species of the animal kingdom whose 11 members exist in Washington in a wild state. This includes but is not 12 13 limited to mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, fish, and 14 invertebrates. The term "wildlife" does not include feral domestic 15 mammals, the family Muridae of the order Rodentia (old world rats and mice), or those fish, shellfish, and marine invertebrates classified as 16 food fish or shellfish by the director. The term "wildlife" includes 17 all stages of development and the bodily parts of wildlife members. 18
- 19 (17) "Wild animals" means those species of the class Mammalia whose 20 members exist in Washington in a wild state and the species Rana 21 catesbeiana (bullfrog). The term "wild animal" does not include feral 22 domestic mammals or the family Muridae of the order Rodentia (old world 23 rats and mice).
- 24 (18) "Wild birds" means those species of the class Aves whose 25 members exist in Washington in a wild state.
- 26 (19) "Protected wildlife" means wildlife designated by the 27 commission that shall not be hunted or fished.
- 28 (20) "Endangered species" means wildlife designated by the 29 commission as seriously threatened with extinction.
- 30 (21) "Game animals" means wild animals that shall not be hunted 31 except as authorized by the commission.
- 32 (22) "Fur-bearing animals" means game animals that shall not be 33 trapped except as authorized by the commission.
- 34 (23) "Game birds" means wild birds that shall not be hunted except 35 as authorized by the commission.
- 36 (24) "Predatory birds" means wild birds that may be hunted 37 throughout the year as authorized by the commission.

- 1 (25) "Deleterious exotic wildlife" means species of the animal 2 kingdom not native to Washington and designated as dangerous to the 3 environment or wildlife of the state.
- 4 (26) "Game farm" means property on which wildlife is held or raised 5 for commercial purposes, trade, or gift. The term "game farm" does not 6 include publicly owned facilities.
- 7 (27) "Person of disability" means a permanently disabled person who 8 is not ambulatory without the assistance of a wheelchair, crutches, or 9 similar devices.
- 10 **Sec. 3.** RCW 77.16.020 and 1987 c 506 s 59 are each amended to read 11 as follows:
- (1) It is unlawful to hunt, fish, <u>or</u> possess((, or control)) a ((species of game bird,)) game animal, <u>game bird,</u> or game fish during ((the)) closed season for that ((species)) <u>game animal, game bird, or game fish except as provided in RCW 77.12.105 or 77.12.265.</u>
- (2) It is unlawful to kill, take, catch, possess, or control ((these species)) a game animal, game bird, or game fish in excess of the number fixed as the bag limit for ((each species)) that game animal, game bird, or game fish.
- 20 (3) It is unlawful to hunt within a game reserve or to fish for 21 game fish within closed waters.
- 22 (4) It is unlawful to hunt wild birds or wild animals within a 23 closed area except as authorized by rule of the commission.
- 24 (5) It is unlawful to hunt or fish for wildlife, practice taxidermy 25 for profit, deal in raw furs for profit, act as a fishing guide, or operate a game farm, stock game fish, or collect wildlife for research 26 or display, without having in possession the license, permit, tag, 27 stamp, or ((punchcard)) catch record card required by chapter 77.32 RCW 28 29 or rule of the department. The activities described in this subsection shall be conducted in accordance with rules adopted pursuant to this 30 31 title.
- 32 <u>(6) For the purposes of this section, the department shall not</u> 33 <u>consider leg length or bill length of dusky Canada geese (Branta</u> 34 canadensis occidentalis).
