1 AN ACT Relating to district court districting committee; and
2 reenacting and amending RCW 3.38.010.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 3.38.010 and 1994 c 81 s 1 and 1994 c 32 s 2 are each
5 reenacted and amended to read as follows:

6 There is established in each county a district court districting
7 committee composed of the following:

8 (1) The judge of the superior court, or, if there be more than one
9 such judge, then one of the judges selected by that court;

10 (2) The prosecuting attorney, or a deputy selected by the
11 prosecuting attorney;

12 (3) A practicing lawyer of the county selected by the president of
13 the largest local bar association, if there be one, and if not, then by
14 the county legislative authority;

15 (4) A judge of a court of limited jurisdiction in the county
16 selected by the president of the Washington state district and
17 municipal court judges' association; and

18 (5) The mayor, or representative appointed by the mayor, of each
19 city or town with a population of three thousand or more in the county;

1 (6) One person to represent the cities and towns with populations
2 of three thousand or less in the county, if any, to be (~~designated by~~
3 ~~the president of the association of Washington cities:— PROVIDED,~~
4 ~~That~~) selected by a majority vote of the mayors of those cities and
5 towns with a population of less than three thousand. However, if there
6 should not be a city in the county with a population of ten thousand or
7 more, the mayor, or the mayor's representative, of each city or town
8 with a population of less than three thousand shall be a member;
9 (7) The chair of the county legislative authority; and
10 (8) The county auditor.
