1 AN ACT Relating to fund-raising on state property to benefit public
2 fish and wildlife programs; and adding a new section to chapter 75.08
3 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 75.08 RCW
6 to read as follows:

7 The manager of a state fish hatchery operated by the department of
8 fish and wildlife may allow nonprofit volunteer groups affiliated with
9 the hatchery to undertake projects to raise donations, gifts, and
10 grants that enhance support for the hatchery or activities in the
11 surrounding watershed that benefit the hatchery. The manager may
12 provide agency personnel and services, if available, to assist in the
13 projects and may allow the volunteer groups to conduct activities on
14 the grounds of the hatchery.

15 The director of the department of fish and wildlife shall encourage
16 and facilitate arrangements between hatchery managers and nonprofit
17 volunteer groups and may establish guidelines for such arrangements.
