1 AN ACT Relating to horticultural facilities; amending RCW 2 19.27.015; adding a new section to chapter 19.27 RCW; and declaring an 3 emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 19.27.015 and 1985 c 360 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 As used in this chapter:

8 (1) "City" means a city or town; ((and))

9 (2) "Multifamily residential building" means common wall 10 residential buildings that consist of four or fewer units, that do not 11 exceed two stories in height, that are less than five thousand square 12 feet in area, and that have a one-hour fire-resistive occupancy 13 separation between units; and

14 (3) "Temporary growing structure" means a structure that has the 15 sides and roof covered with polyethylene, polyvinyl, or similar 16 flexible synthetic material and is used to provide plants with either 17 frost protection or increased heat retention.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 19.27 RCW
to read as follows:

The provisions of this chapter do not apply to temporary growing structures used solely for the commercial production of horticultural plants including ornamental plants, flowers, vegetables, and fruits. A temporary growing structure is not considered a building for purposes of this chapter.

8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate 9 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 10 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take 11 effect immediately.
