- 1 AN ACT Relating to expiration dates on prescriptions dispensed by
- 2 nonresident pharmacies; and amending RCW 18.64.360.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.64.360 and 1991 c 87 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) For the purposes of this chapter any pharmacy located outside
- 7 this state that ships, mails, or delivers, in any manner, except when
- 8 delivered in person to an individual, controlled substances, legend
- 9 drugs, or devices into this state is a nonresident pharmacy, and shall
- 10 be licensed by the department of health, and shall disclose to the
- 11 department the following:
- 12 (a) The location, names, and titles of all owners including
- 13 corporate officers and all pharmacists employed by the pharmacy who are
- 14 dispensing controlled substances, legend drugs, or devices to residents
- 15 of this state. A report containing this information shall be made on
- 16 an annual basis and within ninety days after a change of location,
- 17 corporate officer, or pharmacist;
- 18 (b) Proof of compliance with all lawful directions and requests for
- 19 information from the regulatory or licensing agency of the state in

- 1 which it is licensed as well as with all requests for information made
- 2 by the department of health under this section. The nonresident
- 3 pharmacy shall maintain, at all times, a valid unexpired license,
- 4 permit, or registration to operate the pharmacy in compliance with the
- 5 laws of the state in which it is located. As a prerequisite to be
- 6 licensed by the department of health, the nonresident pharmacy shall
- 7 submit a copy of the most recent inspection report issued by the
- 8 regulatory licensing agency of the state in which it is located;
- 9 (c) Proof that it maintains its records of controlled substances,
- 10 legend drugs, or devices dispensed to patients in this state so that
 - the records are readily retrievable from the records of other drugs
- 12 dispensed.

- 13 (2) Any pharmacy subject to this section shall, during its regular
- 14 hours of operation, provide a toll-free telephone service to facilitate
- 15 communication between patients in this state and a pharmacist at the
- 16 pharmacy who has access to the patient's records. This toll-free
- 17 number shall be disclosed on the label affixed to each container of
- 18 drugs dispensed to patients in this state.
- 19 (3) A pharmacy subject to this section shall comply with board
- 20 rules regarding the maintenance and use of patient medication record
- 21 systems.
- 22 (4) A pharmacy subject to this section shall comply with board of
- 23 pharmacy rules regarding the provision of drug information to the
- 24 patient. Drug information may be contained in written form setting
- 25 forth directions for use and any additional information necessary to
- 26 assure the proper utilization of the medication prescribed. A label
- 27 bearing the expiration date of the prescription must be affixed to each
- 28 box, bottle, jar, tube, or other container of a prescription that is
- 29 <u>dispensed in this state by a pharmacy subject to this section.</u>
- 30 (5) A pharmacy subject to this section shall not dispense
- 31 medication in a quantity greater than authorized by the prescriber.
- 32 (6) The license fee specified by the secretary, in accordance with
- 33 the provisions of RCW 43.70.250, shall not exceed the fee charged to a
- 34 pharmacy located in this state.
- 35 (7) The license requirements of this section apply to nonresident
- 36 pharmacies that ship, mail, or deliver controlled substances, legend
- 37 drugs, and devices into this state only under a prescription. The
- 38 board of pharmacy may grant an exemption from licensing under this

- section upon application by an out-of-state pharmacy that restricts its dispensing activity in Washington to isolated transactions.
- (8) Each nonresident pharmacy that ships, mails, or delivers legend drugs or devices into this state shall designate a resident agent in Washington for service of process. The designation of such an agent does not indicate that the nonresident pharmacy is a resident of Washington for tax purposes.
