1 AN ACT Relating to the impact of taxes on warehouse and
2 distribution activity; and creating new sections.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The department of revenue shall perform
5 a study to:

6 (a) Determine the current and potential impact of warehouse and
7 distribution activity on the Washington economy;

8 (b) Analyze how the current tax structure affects warehouse and
9 distribution activity;

10 (c) Evaluate alternative methods of taxing warehouse and
11 distribution activity;

12 (d) Identify the effects of tax incentives for warehouse and
13 distribution activity; and

14 (e) Evaluate the impact of any potential changes in taxation of
15 warehouse and distribution activity on equity among other industries
16 and upon the overall state tax structure.

17 (2) To perform this study, the department shall form an advisory
18 study committee which may include representation from warehouse and
19 distribution interests, local government, and other interest groups.

1 The advisory committee shall also include, but need not be limited to,
2 two members from the house of representatives and two members from the
3 senate.

4 (3) The department of revenue shall provide staff for the purpose
5 of the study.

6 (4) The department of revenue shall present a final report of the
7 findings of the study to the committees of the legislature that deal
8 with revenue matters by December 1, 1996.

9 (5) The department of revenue shall not perform the study under
10 this section unless matching funds in the amount of forty-five thousand
11 dollars are provided from other public and private sources.

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** If specific funding in the amount of forty-
13 five thousand dollars for the purposes of this act, referencing this
14 act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by June 30, 1996, in the
15 omnibus appropriations act, this act is null and void.
