1 AN ACT Relating to a death benefit award for certain law
2 enforcement officers, fire fighters, and commissioned employees of the
3 Washington state patrol who die in the line of duty; adding a new
4 section to chapter 41.26 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 43.43
5 RCW; creating a new section; and declaring an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 41.26 RCW
8 under the subchapter heading "provisions applicable to plan I and plan
9 II" to read as follows:

10 (1) A one hundred fifty thousand dollar death benefit shall be paid
11 to the member's estate, or such person or persons, trust or
12 organization as the member shall have nominated by written designation
13 duly executed and filed with the department. If there be no such
14 designated person or persons still living at the time of the member's
15 death, such member's death benefit shall be paid to the member's
16 surviving spouse as if in fact such spouse had been nominated by
17 written designation, or if there be no such surviving spouse, then to
18 such member's legal representatives.

1 (2) The benefit under this section shall be paid only where death
2 occurs as a result of injuries sustained in the course of employment.
3 The determination of eligibility for the benefit shall be made
4 consistent with Title 51 RCW by the department of labor and industries.
5 The department of labor and industries shall notify the department of
6 retirement systems by order under RCW 51.52.050.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.43 RCW
8 to read as follows:

9 (1) A one hundred fifty thousand dollar death benefit shall be paid
10 to the member's estate, or such person or persons, trust or
11 organization as the member shall have nominated by written designation
12 duly executed and filed with the department. If there be no such
13 designated person or persons still living at the time of the member's
14 death, such member's death benefit shall be paid to the member's
15 surviving spouse as if in fact such spouse had been nominated by
16 written designation, or if there be no such surviving spouse, then to
17 such member's legal representatives.

18 (2) The benefit under this section shall be paid only where death
19 occurs as a result of injuries sustained in the course of employment.
20 The determination of eligibility for the benefit shall be made
21 consistent with Title 51 RCW by the department of labor and industries.
22 The department of labor and industries shall notify the department of
23 retirement systems by order under RCW 51.52.050.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** The Joint Committee on Pension Policy will
25 conduct a study on providing a similar death benefit for volunteer fire
26 fighters and reserve law enforcement officers and report back to the
27 appropriate legislative committees by December 1, 1996.

28 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** This act is necessary for the immediate
29 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
30 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
31 effect immediately.
