- 1 AN ACT Relating to the principal internship support program; and
- 2 amending RCW 28A.415.270 and 28A.415.280.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.415.270 and 1993 c 336 s 404 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 (1) To the extent funds are appropriated, the Washington state
- 7 principal internship support program is created beginning in the 1994-
- 8 95 school year. The purpose of the program is to provide funds to
- 9 school districts to ((hire substitutes)) provide partial release time
- 10 for district employees who are in a principal preparation program to
- 11 complete an internship with a mentor principal. Funds may be used in
- 12 a variety of ways to accommodate flexible implementation in releasing
- 13 the intern to meet program requirements.
- 14 (2) Participants in the principal internship support program shall
- 15 be selected as follows:
- 16 (a) The candidate shall be enrolled in a state board-approved
- 17 school principal preparation program;
- 18 (b) The candidate shall apply in writing to his or her local school
- 19 district;

- (c) Each school district shall determine which applicants meet its 1 criteria for participation in the principal internship support program 2 3 and shall notify its educational service district of the school 4 district's selected applicants. When submitting the names of applicants, the school district shall identify a mentor principal for 5 each principal intern applicant, and shall agree to provide the 6 7 internship applicant ((at least)) release time not to exceed the 8 equivalent of forty-five student days ((of release time for the 9 internship()) by means of this funding source; and
- 10 (d) Educational service districts, with the assistance of an 11 advisory board, shall select internship participants.
- (3)(((a))) The maximum amount of state funding for each internship shall ((be the estimated state-wide average)) not exceed the actual daily rate cost of providing a substitute teacher for the equivalent of forty-five school days.

 - If it is not possible to find qualified candidates reflecting the percentage of minorities of the student population of the educational service district, the educational service district shall select those qualified candidates who meet these criteria and leave the remaining positions unfilled, and any unspent funds shall revert to the state general fund.)) If it is not possible to find qualified candidates within the educational service district, the positions remain unfilled, and any unspent funds shall revert to the superintendent of public instruction for supplementary direct disbursement.
- The superintendent of public instruction shall allocate any remaining unfilled positions and unspent funds among the educational service districts that have qualified candidates but not enough positions for them.
- This subsection does not preclude the superintendent of public instruction from permitting the affected educational service districts to make the supplementary selections.

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- 1 (((c))) (<u>5)</u> Once principal internship participants have been 2 selected, the educational service districts shall allocate the funds to 3 the appropriate school districts. The funds shall be used to pay for 4 ((replacement substitute staff)) partial release time while the school 5 district employee is completing the principal internship.

- 9 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.415.280 and 1993 c 336 s 405 are each amended to 10 read as follows:
- (1) To the extent funds are appropriated, the Washington state 11 12 superintendent and program administrator internship support program is created beginning in the 1994-95 school year. The purpose of the 13 14 program is to provide funds to school districts to ((hire substitutes)) provide partial release time for district employees who are in a 15 16 superintendent or program administrator preparation program to complete an internship with a mentor administrator. Funds may be used in a 17 18 variety of ways to accommodate flexible implementation in releasing the intern to meet program requirements. 19
- 20 (2) Participants in the superintendent and program administrator 21 internship support program shall be selected as follows:
- 22 (a) The candidate shall be enrolled in a state board-approved 23 school district superintendent or program administrator preparation 24 program;
- 25 (b) The candidate shall apply in writing to his or her local school district;
- 27 (c) Each school district shall determine which applicants meet its criteria for participation in the internship support program and shall 28 29 notify its educational service district of the school district's 30 selected applicants. When submitting the names of applicants, the school district shall identify a mentor administrator for each intern 31 applicant and shall agree to provide the internship applicant ((at 32 33 least)) release time not to exceed the equivalent of forty-five student 34 days ((of release time for the internship)) by means of this funding 35 <u>source</u>; and

- internship participants have been selected, 14 (C) Once the 15 educational service districts shall allocate the funds to the appropriate school districts. The funds shall be used to pay for 16 17 ((replacement substitute staff)) partial release time while the school district employee is completing the internship. 18
- 19 (d) If an educational service district has unfilled superintendent 20 or program administrator internship positions, the positions and 21 unspent funds shall revert to the superintendent of public instruction 22 for supplementary direct disbursement among the educational service 23 districts.
- The superintendent of public instruction shall allocate any remaining unfilled positions and unspent funds among the educational service districts that have qualified candidates but not enough positions for them.
- This subsection does not preclude the superintendent of public instruction from permitting the affected educational service districts to make the supplementary selections.
- 31 <u>(e)</u> Educational service districts may be reimbursed for costs 32 associated with implementing the program. Reimbursement rates shall be 33 determined by the superintendent of public instruction.
