- 1 AN ACT Relating to recreational vehicle sanitary disposal
- 2 facilities; amending RCW 46.16.063, 46.68.170, and 47.38.050; and
- 3 providing an effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.16.063 and 1980 c 60 s 2 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 In addition to other fees for the licensing of vehicles there shall
- 8 be paid and collected annually for each camper, travel trailer, and
- 9 motor home as the same are defined in RCW 82.50.010 a fee of ((one))
- 10 three dollars to be deposited in the RV account of the motor vehicle
- 11 fund. <u>Under RCW 43.135.055</u>, the department of transportation may
- 12 <u>increase RV account fees by a percentage that exceeds the fiscal growth</u>
- 13 factor. After consultation with citizen representatives of the
- 14 recreational vehicle user community, the department of transportation
- 15 may implement RV account fee adjustments no more than once every four
- 16 years. RV account fee adjustments must be preceded by evaluation of
- 17 the following factors: Maintenance of a self-supporting program,
- 18 levels of service at existing RV sanitary disposal facilities,
- 19 identified needs for improved RV service at safety rest areas state-

- 1 wide, sewage treatment costs, and inflation. If the department chooses
- 2 to adjust the RV account fee, it shall notify the department of
- 3 <u>licensing six months before implementation of the fee increase.</u>
- 4 Adjustments in the RV account fee must be in increments of no more than
- 5 fifty cents per biennium.
- 6 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.68.170 and 1980 c 60 s 3 are each amended to read 7 as follows:
- 8 There is hereby created in the motor vehicle fund the RV account.
- 9 All moneys hereafter deposited in said account shall be used by the
- 10 department of transportation for the construction ((and)), maintenance,
- 11 and operation of recreational vehicle sanitary disposal systems at
- 12 <u>safety</u> rest areas ((on federal-aid highways)) <u>in accordance with the</u>
- 13 <u>department's highway system plan as prescribed in chapter 47.06 RCW</u>.
- 14 **Sec. 3.** RCW 47.38.050 and 1980 c 60 s 1 are each amended to read 15 as follows:
- 16 The department of transportation shall construct and maintain
- 17 recreational vehicle sanitary disposal systems in the following safety
- 18 rest areas lying along highways which are a part of the interstate
- 19 highway system:
- 20 (1) Gee Creek <u>safety</u> rest area, northbound and southbound on
- 21 Interstate 5 in Clark county;
- 22 (2) Sea-Tac <u>safety</u> rest area, northbound on Interstate 5 in King
- 23 county;
- 24 (3) Silver Lake <u>safety</u> rest area, southbound on Interstate 5 in
- 25 Snohomish county;
- 26 (4) Winchester Wasteway <u>safety</u> rest area, eastbound and westbound
- 27 on Interstate 90 in Grant county;
- 28 (5) Sprague <u>safety</u> rest area, eastbound on Interstate 90 in Lincoln
- 29 county; ((and))
- 30 (6) Selah Creek <u>safety</u> rest area, northbound and southbound on
- 31 Interstate 82 in Yakima county:
- 32 (7) Indian John Hill safety rest area, eastbound and westbound on
- 33 <u>Interstate 90 in Kittitas county;</u>
- 34 (8) Smokey Point safety rest area, northbound and southbound on
- 35 <u>Interstate 5 in Snohomish county;</u>
- 36 (9) Schrag safety rest area, westbound on Interstate 90 in Adams
- 37 <u>county</u>.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Section 1 of this act takes effect with
- 2 motor vehicle fees due or to become due September 1, 1996.
