1 AN ACT Relating to vocational student leadership organizations; 2 adding a new section to chapter 28A.300 RCW; and creating a new 3 section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes the benefit of 6 vocational student leadership organizations in preparing students for 7 career experiences beyond high school. Through the efforts of these 8 organizations, students receive opportunities to develop personal, 9 leadership, vocational, and technical skills that may not be attained 10 through classroom activities.

The unique opportunities offered by these organizations are an 11 12 integral part of the vocational technical instructional program, 13 facilitating the development of interpersonal, communication, and 14 leadership skills of participating students. These skills are 15 necessary for the critical thinking, problem solving, and decisionmaking responsibilities of the work force and for the management of 16 17 work, community, and family roles. The emphasis on such skills is essential in the transition from school to career, focusing students' 18

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attention to the application of education and training to gainful
 employment and community and family interactions.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28A.300
4 RCW to read as follows:

(1) The legislature recognizes the necessity for maintaining and 5 promoting vocational student leadership organizations as an integral 6 7 part of the instruction in approved vocational technical programs. The 8 office of the superintendent of public instruction shall maintain support for the state-wide coordination of vocational 9 student leadership organizations within the office of the superintendent of 10 public instruction for each approved vocational technical program 11 established within the office of the superintendent of public 12 13 instruction. Programs include but shall not be limited to: 14 Agriculture; business; family and consumer sciences; 15 marketing/diversified occupations; and trade/industrial, technology 16 education, and health occupations.

17 (2) The office of the superintendent of public instruction shall 18 act as support for the coordination of the state-wide efforts of the various student leadership organizations. The program director of 19 those programs identified in subsection (1) of this section shall 20 continue their management of these programs to maintain their 21 continuity. The superintendent of public instruction may continue to 22 23 engage in independent contracts for vocational student leadership 24 organization coordinators.

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
