- 1 AN ACT Relating to metal detectors in state parks; adding new
- 2 sections to chapter 43.51 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. It is the intent of the legislature that
- 5 those significant historic archaeological resources on state park lands
- 6 that are of importance to the history of our state, or its communities,
- 7 be protected for the people of the state. At the same time, the
- 8 legislature also recognizes that the recreational use of metal
- 9 detectors in state parks is a legitimate form of recreation that can be
- 10 compatible with the protection of significant historic archaeological
- 11 resources.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.51 RCW
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (1) By September 1, 1997, the commission shall increase the area
- 15 available for use by recreational metal detectors by at least two
- 16 hundred acres.
- 17 (2) Beginning September 1, 1998, and each year thereafter until
- 18 August 31, 2003, the commission shall increase the area of land

- 1 available for use by recreational metal detectors by at least fifty 2 acres.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 43.51 RCW to read as follows:
- 5 (1) The commission shall develop a cost-effective plan to identify 6 historic archaeological resources in at least one state park containing 7 a military fort located in Puget Sound. The plan shall include the use 8 of a professional archaeologist and volunteer citizens. By December 1, 9 1997, the commission shall submit a brief report to the appropriate 10 standing committees of the legislature on how the plan will be 11 implemented and the cost of the plan.
- 12 (2) Any park land that is made available for use by recreational 13 metal detectors under this section shall count toward the requirements 14 established in section 2 of this act.
