1 AN ACT Relating to the state fossil; adding a new section to 2 chapter 1.20 RCW; and creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes that the large, 5 hairy prehistoric elephants of the extinct genus Mammuthus roamed the 6 north American continent, including the Pacific Northwest, during the 7 Pleistocene epoch (Ice Ages).

8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 1.20 RCW 9 to read as follows:

10 The Columbian mammoth of North America, Mammuthus COLUMBI, is 11 hereby designated as the official fossil of the state of Washington.
