1 AN ACT Relating to regulation of electricians and electrical 2 installations; and amending RCW 19.28.510, 19.28.520, 19.28.530, and 3 19.28.070.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 19.28.510 and 1996 c 241 s 6 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 (1) No person may engage in the electrical construction trade 8 without having a current journeyman electrician certificate of 9 competency or a current specialty electrician certificate of competency 10 issued by the department in accordance with this chapter. Electrician 11 certificate of competency specialties include, but are not limited to: 12 Residential, domestic appliances, pump and irrigation, limited energy 13 system, signs, and nonresidential maintenance.

(2) A person who is indentured in an apprenticeship program approved under chapter 49.04 RCW for the electrical construction trade or who is learning the electrical construction trade may work in the electrical construction trade if supervised by a certified journeyman electrician or a certified specialty electrician in that electrician's specialty. All apprentices and individuals learning the electrical

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construction trade shall obtain an electrical training certificate from 1 the department. The certificate shall authorize the holder to learn 2 the electrical construction trade while under the direct supervision of 3 4 a journeyman electrician or a specialty electrician working in his or 5 her specialty. The holder of the electrical training certificate shall renew the certificate annually. At the time of renewal, the holder б 7 shall provide the department with an accurate list of the holder's 8 employers in the electrical construction industry for the previous year 9 and the number of hours worked for each employer. An annual fee shall 10 be charged for the issuance or renewal of the certificate. The department shall set the fee by rule. The fee shall cover but not 11 12 exceed the cost of administering and enforcing the trainee 13 certification and supervision requirements this of chapter. Apprentices and individuals learning the electrical construction trade 14 15 shall have their electrical training certificates in their possession at all times that they are performing electrical work. They shall show 16 17 their certificates to an authorized representative of the department at the representative's request. 18

19 (3) Any person who has been issued an electrical training 20 certificate under this chapter may work if that person is under supervision. Supervision shall consist of a person being on the same 21 job site and under the control of either a journeyman electrician or an 22 23 appropriate specialty electrician who has an applicable certificate of 24 competency issued under this chapter. Either a journeyman electrician 25 or an appropriate specialty electrician shall be on the same job site 26 as the noncertified individual for a minimum of seventy-five percent of 27 each working day unless otherwise provided in this chapter. ((The ratio of noncertified individuals to certified journeymen or specialty 28 29 electricians working on a job site shall be:

30 (a) From September 1, 1979, through December 31, 1982, not more 31 than three noncertified electricians working on any one job site for 32 every certified journeyman or specialty electrician;

33 (b) Effective January 1, 1983,)) (4) The ratio of noncertified 34 individuals to certified journeymen or specialty electricians working 35 on a job site shall be:

36 (a) Not more than two noncertified individuals working on any one 37 job site for every specialty electrician or journeyman electrician 38 working as a specialty electrician(($\dot{\tau}$

39 (c) Effective January 1, 1983,)); and

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(b) Not more than one noncertified individual working on any one 1 2 job site for every certified journeyman electrician((-)), except that the ratio requirements ((do not apply to a trade school program in the 3 4 electrical construction trade established during 1946)) shall be one certified journeyman electrician to no more than four students enrolled 5 in and working as part of an electrical construction program at public 6 7 community or technical colleges, or not-for-profit nationally 8 accredited trade or technical schools licensed by the work force 9 training and education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW. In 10 meeting the ratio requirements for students enrolled in an electrical construction program at a trade school, a trade school may receive 11 input and advice from the electrical board. 12

13 An individual who has a current training certificate and who has successfully completed or is currently enrolled in an approved 14 15 apprenticeship program or in ((a technical school)) an electrical 16 construction program ((in the electrical construction trade in a school approved)) at public community or technical colleges, or not-for-profit 17 nationally accredited technical or trade schools licensed by the 18 19 ((commission for vocational education)) work force training and education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW, may work without 20 direct on-site supervision during the last six months of meeting the 21 22 practical experience requirements of this chapter.

23 (((4))) (5) The electrical contractor shall accurately verify and 24 attest to the electrical trainee hours worked by electrical trainees on 25 behalf of the electrical contractor.

26 **Sec. 2.** RCW 19.28.520 and 1980 c 30 s 3 are each amended to read 27 as follows:

Any person desiring to be issued a certificate of competency as 28 29 provided in this chapter shall deliver evidence in a form prescribed by 30 the department affirming that said person has met the qualifications required under RCW 19.28.530((, as now or hereafter amended)). 31 An electrician from another jurisdiction applying for a certificate of 32 33 competency must provide evidence in a form prescribed by the department 34 affirming that the person has the equivalent qualifications to those required under RCW 19.28.530. 35

36 **Sec. 3.** RCW 19.28.530 and 1988 c 81 s 13 are each amended to read 37 as follows:

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1 (1) Upon receipt of the application, the department shall review 2 the application and determine whether the applicant is eligible to take 3 an examination for the journeyman or specialty certificate of 4 competency.

5 <u>(a)</u> To be eligible to take the examination for a journeyman 6 certificate the applicant must have:

7 (i) Worked in the electrical construction trade for a minimum of 8 four years employed full time, of which two years shall be in 9 industrial or commercial electrical installation under the supervision 10 of a journeyman electrician ((certified under this chapter)) and not more than a total of two years in all specialties under the supervision 11 12 of a journeyman electrician ((certified under this chapter)) or an 13 appropriate specialty electrician ((certified under this chapter or 14 have)); or

15 <u>(ii)</u> Successfully completed an apprenticeship program approved 16 under chapter 49.04 RCW for the electrical construction trade.

17 (b) To be eligible to take the examination to become a specialty 18 electrician the applicant shall have:

19 (i) Worked in that specialty of the electrical construction trade, 20 under the supervision of a journeyman electrician ((certified under 21 this chapter)) or an appropriate specialty electrician ((certified 22 under this chapter)), for a minimum of two years employed full 23 time((-,)); or ((have))

<u>(ii)</u> Successfully completed an approved apprenticeship program
under chapter 49.04 RCW for the applicant's specialty in the electrical
construction trade.

27 ((Before January 1, 1984, applicants for nonresidential maintenance specialty licenses are eligible to become nonresidential maintenance 28 29 specialists upon certification to the department that they have the 30 equivalent of two years full-time experience in that specialty field. 31 Persons applying before January 1, 1984, for a journeyman certificate are eligible to take the examination to become journeymen until July 1, 32 1984, upon certification to the department that they have the 33 34 equivalent of five years full-time experience in nonresidential 35 maintenance, of which two years shall be in industrial electrical installation.)) 36

37 (c) Any applicant who has successfully completed a two-year 38 ((technical school)) program in the electrical construction trade ((in 39 a school that is approved)) at public community or technical colleges,

or not-for-profit nationally accredited technical or trade schools 1 <u>licensed</u> by the ((commission for vocational education)) work force 2 training and education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW may 3 4 substitute up to two years of the technical or trade school program for two years of work experience under a journeyman electrician. 5 The applicant shall obtain the additional two years of work experience 6 7 required in industrial or commercial electrical installation prior to 8 the beginning, or after the completion, of the technical school 9 program. Any applicant who has received training in the electrical 10 construction trade in the armed service of the United States may be eligible to take the examination for the certificate of competency. 11 12 ((Any applicant who is a graduate of a trade school program in the electrical construction trade that was established during 1946 is 13 14 eligible to take the examination for the certificate of competency.)) 15 (d) No other requirement for eligibility may be imposed.

16 (2) The department shall establish reasonable rules for the 17 examinations to be given applicants for certificates of competency. In 18 establishing the rules, the department shall consult with the board. 19 Upon determination that the applicant is eligible to take the 20 examination, the department shall so notify the applicant, indicating 21 the time and place for taking the examination.

22 **Sec. 4.** RCW 19.28.070 and 1986 c 156 s 4 are each amended to read 23 as follows:

24 The director of labor and industries of the state of Washington and 25 the officials of all incorporated cities and towns where electrical inspections are required by local ordinances shall have power and it 26 27 shall be their duty to enforce the provisions of this chapter in their respective jurisdictions. The director of labor and industries shall 28 29 ((have power to)) appoint ((an)) a chief electrical inspector((, and 30 such assistant inspectors as he shall deem necessary to assist him in the performance of his duties)) and may appoint other electrical 31 inspectors as the director deems necessary to assist the director in 32 33 the performance of the director's duties. The chief electrical inspector, subject to the review of the director, shall be responsible 34 35 for providing the final interpretation of adopted state electrical 36 standards, rules, and policies for the department and its inspectors, 37 assistant inspectors, electrical plan examiners, and other individuals supervising electrical program personnel. If a dispute arises within 38

the department regarding the interpretation of adopted state electrical 1 standards, rules, or policies, the chief electrical inspector, subject 2 to the review of the director, shall provide the final interpretation 3 4 of the disputed standard, rule, or policy. All electrical inspectors appointed by the director of labor and industries shall have not less 5 than: Four years experience as journeyman electricians in the 6 7 electrical construction trade installing and maintaining electrical 8 wiring and equipment, or two years electrical training in a college of 9 electrical engineering of recognized standing and four years continuous 10 practical electrical experience in installation work, or four years of electrical training in a college of electrical engineering of 11 recognized standing and two years continuous practical electrical 12 13 experience in electrical installation work; or four years experience as a journeyman electrician performing the duties of an electrical 14 15 inspector employed by the department or a city or town with an approved inspection program under RCW 19.28.360, except that for work performed 16 in accordance with the national electrical safety code and covered by 17 this chapter, such inspections may be performed by a person certified 18 19 as an outside journeyman lineman, under RCW 19.28.610(2), with four years experience or a person with four years experience as a certified 20 outside journeyman lineman performing the duties of an electrical 21 inspector employed by an electrical utility. Such state inspectors 22 shall be paid such salary as the director of labor and industries shall 23 24 determine, together with their travel expenses in accordance with RCW 25 43.03.050 and 43.03.060 as now existing or hereafter amended. <u>As a</u> condition of employment, inspectors hired exclusively to perform 26 inspections in accordance with the national electrical safety code must 27 possess and maintain certification as an outside journeyman lineman. 28 The expenses of the director of labor and industries and the salaries 29 30 and expenses of state inspectors incurred in carrying out the provisions of this chapter shall be paid entirely out of the electrical 31 license fund, upon vouchers approved by the director of labor and 32 industries. 33

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
