- 7 This chapter does not apply to amounts received by a motor vehicle
- 8 manufacturer, as defined in RCW 19.118.021, or by a financing
- 9 subsidiary of such motor vehicle manufacturer which subsidiary is at
- 10 least fifty percent owned by the manufacturer, from the sale of motor
- 11 vehicles at wholesale auctions to dealers licensed under chapter 46.70
- 12 RCW or dealers licensed by any other state.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 14 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 15 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 16 immediately.
