1 AN ACT Relating to employment agencies; and amending RCW 19.31.020.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

3 **Sec. 1.** RCW 19.31.020 and 1993 c 499 s 1 are each amended to read 4 as follows:

5 Unless a different meaning is clearly required by the context, the 6 following words and phrases, as hereinafter used in this chapter, shall 7 have the following meanings:

8 (1) "Employment agency" is synonymous with "agency" and shall mean 9 any business in which any part of the business gross or net income is 10 derived from a fee received from applicants, and in which any of the 11 following activities are engaged in:

12 (a) The offering, promising, procuring, or attempting to procure13 employment for applicants;

(b) The giving of information regarding where and from whomemployment may be obtained; or

(c) The sale of a list of jobs or a list of names of persons or
 companies accepting applications for specific positions, in any form.
 In addition the term "employment agency" shall mean and include any
 person, bureau, employment listing service, employment directory,

organization, or school which for profit, by advertisement or 1 2 otherwise, offers, as one of its main objects or purposes, to procure employment for any person who pays for its services, or which collects 3 4 tuition, or charges for service of any nature, where the main object of 5 the person paying the same is to secure employment. It also includes any business that provides a resume to an individual and provides that 6 7 person with a list of names to whom the resume may be sent or provides 8 that person with preaddressed envelopes to be mailed by the individual 9 or by the business itself, if the list of names or the preaddressed envelopes have been compiled and are represented by the business as 10 11 having job openings. The term "employment agency" shall not include 12 labor union organizations, temporary service contractors, proprietary 13 schools operating within the scope of activities for which the school is licensed under chapter 28C.10 RCW, nonprofit schools and colleges, 14 15 career guidance and counseling services, employment directories that 16 are sold in a manner that allows the applicant to examine the directory 17 before purchase, theatrical agencies, farm labor contractors, or the 18 Washington state employment agency.

19 (2) "Temporary service contractors" shall mean any person, firm, 20 association, or corporation conducting a business which consists of 21 employing individuals directly for the purpose of furnishing such 22 individuals on a part time or temporary help basis to others.

23 (3) "Theatrical agency" means any person who, for a fee or 24 commission, procures ((or attempts to procure)) on behalf of an 25 individual or individuals, employment or engagements for circus, 26 vaudeville, the variety field, the legitimate theater, motion pictures, 27 radio, television, phonograph recordings, transcriptions, opera, concert, ballet, modeling, or other entertainments, exhibitions, or 28 performances. The term "theatrical agency" does not include any person 29 30 charging an applicant a fee prior to or in advance of:

(a) Procuring employment for the applicant;

32 (b) Giving or providing the applicant information regarding where
33 or from whom employment may be obtained;

34 (c) Allowing or requiring the applicant to participate in any
 35 instructional class, audition, or career guidance or counseling; or

36 (d) Allowing the applicant to be eligible for employment through
 37 the person.

(4) "Farm labor contractor" means any person, or his agent, who,for a fee, employs workers to render personal services in connection

with the production of any farm products, to, for, or under the 1 2 direction of an employer engaged in the growing, producing, or harvesting of farm products, or who recruits, solicits, supplies, or 3 4 hires workers on behalf of an employer engaged in the growing, 5 producing, or harvesting of farm products or who provides in connection with recruiting, soliciting, supplying, or hiring workers engaged in 6 the growing, producing, or harvesting of farm products, one or more of 7 8 the following services: Furnishes board, lodging, or transportation 9 for such workers, supervises, times, checks, counts, sizes, or 10 otherwise directs or measures their work; or disburses wage payments to 11 such persons.

(5) "Employer" means any person, firm, corporation, partnership, or
association employing or seeking to enter into an arrangement to employ
a person through the medium or service of an employment agency.

(6) "Applicant", except when used to describe an applicant for an employment agency license, means any person, whether employed or unemployed, seeking or entering into any arrangement for his employment or change of his employment through the medium or service of an employment agency.

(7) "Person" includes any individual, firm, corporation,
partnership, association, company, society, manager, contractor,
subcontractor, bureau, agency, service, office, or an agent or employee
of any of the foregoing.

(8) "Director" shall mean the director of licensing.

(9) "Resume" means a document of the applicant's employment historythat is approved, received, and paid for by the applicant.

(10) "Fee" means anything of value. The term includes money or other valuable consideration or services or the promise of money or other valuable consideration or services, received directly or indirectly by an employment agency from a person seeking employment, in payment for the service.

(11) "Employment listing service" means any business operated by 32 33 any person that provides in any form, including written or verbal, 34 lists of specified positions of employment available with any employer 35 other than itself or that holds itself out to applicants as able to provide information about specific positions of employment available 36 37 with any employer other than itself, and that charges a fee to the applicant for its services and does not set up interviews or otherwise 38 39 intercede between employer and applicant.

1 (12) "Employment directory" means any business operated by any 2 person that provides in any form, including written or verbal, lists of 3 employers, does not provide lists of specified positions of employment, 4 that holds itself out to applicants as able to provide information on 5 employment in specific industries or geographical areas, and that 6 charges a fee to the applicant for its services.

7 (13) "Career guidance and counseling service" means any person,
8 firm, association, or corporation conducting a business that engages in
9 any of the following activities:

(a) Career assessment, planning, or testing through individualcounseling or group seminars, classes, or workshops;

(b) Skills analysis, resume writing, and preparation throughindividual counseling or group seminars, classes, or workshops;

14 (c) Training in job search or interviewing skills through 15 individual counseling or group seminars, classes, or workshops: 16 PROVIDED, That the career guidance and counseling service does not 17 engage in any of the following activities:

(i) Contacts employers on behalf of an applicant or in any wayintercedes between employer and applicant;

20 (ii) Provides information on specific job openings;

(iii) Holds itself out as able to provide referrals to specificcompanies or individuals who have specific job openings.
