- 1 AN ACT Relating to increasing public participation in the 2 establishment of natural area preserves; amending RCW 79.70.070; and
- 3 adding a new section to chapter 79.70 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 79.70.070 and 1994 c 264 s 62 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 (1) The natural heritage advisory council is hereby established.
- 8 The council shall consist of fifteen members, ((nine)) ten of whom
- 9 shall be chosen as follows and who shall elect from the council's
- 10 membership a chairperson:
- 11 (a) Five individuals, appointed by the commissioner, who shall be
- 12 recognized experts in the ecology of natural areas and represent the
- 13 public, academic, and private sectors. Desirable fields of expertise
- 14 are biological and geological sciences; and
- 15 (b) ((Four)) <u>Five</u> individuals, appointed by the commissioner, who
- 16 shall be selected from the various regions of the state. At least one
- 17 member shall be or represent a private forest landowner and at least
- 18 one member shall be or represent a private agricultural landowner.

- 1 (2) Members appointed under subsection (1) of this section shall 2 serve for terms of four years.
- 3 (3) In addition to the members appointed by the commissioner, the 4 director of the department of fish and wildlife, the director of the 5 department of ecology, the supervisor of the department of natural 6 resources, the director of the state parks and recreation commission, 7 and the administrator of the interagency committee for outdoor 8 recreation, or an authorized representative of each agency officer,
- 10 (4) Any vacancy on the council shall be filled by appointment for 11 the unexpired term by the commissioner.

shall serve as ex officio, nonvoting members of the council.

- 12 (5) In order to provide for staggered terms, of the initial members 13 of the council:
  - (a) Three shall serve for a term of two years;
- 15 (b) Three shall serve for a term of three years; and
- 16 (c) Three shall serve for a term of four years.
- 17 (6) Members of the natural preserves advisory committee serving on 18 July 26, 1981, shall serve as members of the council until the 19 commissioner appoints a successor to each. The successor appointment 20 shall be specifically designated to replace a member of the natural 21 preserves advisory committee until all members of that committee have 22 been replaced. A member of the natural preserves advisory committee is 23 eligible for appointment to the council if otherwise qualified.
- (7) Members of the council shall serve without compensation.

  Members shall be reimbursed for travel expenses as provided in RCW

  43.03.050 and 43.03.060 as now or hereafter amended.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 79.70 RCW to read as follows:
- The department shall hold a public hearing in the county where the majority of the land in a proposed natural area preserve is located prior to establishing the boundary.
