- (1) Any person requested or signaled to stop by a law enforcement 6 officer for a traffic infraction has a duty to stop.
- (2) Whenever any person is stopped for a traffic infraction, the 8
- officer may detain that person for a reasonable period of time 9
- 10 necessary to identify the person, check for outstanding warrants, check
- the status of the person's license, insurance identification card, and 11
- 12 the vehicle's registration, and complete and issue a notice of traffic
