- 1 AN ACT Relating to certificated instructional staff salaries;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 28A.415 RCW; providing an effective
- 3 date; and declaring an emergency.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 28A.415 6 RCW to read as follows:
- 7 (1) Credits earned by certificated instructional staff after
- September 1, 1995, shall be eligible for application to the salary 8
- schedule developed by the legislative evaluation and accountability 9
- 10 program committee only if the course content:
- 11 (a) Is consistent with a school-based plan for mastery of student
- learning goals as referenced in RCW 28A.320.205, the annual school 12
- 13 performance report, for the school in which the individual is assigned;
- 14 (b) Pertains to the individual's current assignment or expected
- 15 assignment for the subsequent school year;
- (c) Is necessary to obtain an endorsement as prescribed by the 16
- 17 state board of education;
- (d) Is specifically required to obtain advanced levels 18
- 19 certification; or

- 1 (e) Is included in a college or university degree program that 2 pertains to the individual's current assignment, or potential future 3 assignment, as a certified instructional staff.
- 4 (2) For the purpose of this section, "credits" mean college quarter 5 hour credits and equivalent credits for approved in-service, approved 6 continuing education, or approved internship hours computed in 7 accordance with RCW 28A.415.020.
- 8 (3) The superintendent of public instruction shall adopt rules and 9 standards consistent with the limits established by this section for 10 certificated instructional staff.
- \*NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect June 30, 1997.
- 15 \*Sec. 2 was vetoed. See message at end of chapter.

Approved by the Governor April 19, 1997, with the exception of certain items that were vetoed.

- 1 Note: Governor's explanation of partial veto is as follows:
- "I am returning herewith, without my approval as to section 2, 3 Senate Bill No. 5925 entitled:
- 4 "AN ACT Relating to certified instructional staff salaries;"
- The emergency clause in section 2 is not needed. SB 5925 codifies the current state policy on credits recognized for state funding. The bill will not affect state funding or school district reporting for the 1996-97 school year. Without the emergency clause, the bill will take effect before September 1, 1997, the beginning of the 1997-98 school year.
- For these reasons, I have vetoed section 2 of Senate Bill No. 5925.
  With the exception of section 2, I am approving Senate Bill No. 5925.
