- 12 **Sec. 1.** RCW 16.36.005 and 1987 c 163 s 1 are each amended to read
- 13 as follows:
- 14 As used in this chapter:
- 15 "Animal" means all members of the animal kingdom except humans,
- 16 fish, and insects. However, "animal" does not mean non-captive
- 17 wildlife as defined in RCW 77.08.010(16), except as used in RCW
- 18 <u>16.36.050(1)</u> and RCW 16.36.080(1),(2),(3), and (5).

- "Animal reproductive product" means sperm, ova, fertilized ova, and
 embryos from animals.
- 3 <u>"Farm-raised fish" means fish raised by aquaculture as defined in</u>
- 4 RCW 15.85.020. Farm-raised fish are considered to be a part of animal
- 5 <u>agriculture; however, disease inspection, prevention, and control</u>
- 6 programs and related activities for farm-raised fish are administered
- 7 by the department of fish and wildlife under chapter 75.58 RCW.
- 8 "Communicable disease" means a disease due to a specific infectious
- 9 agent or its toxic products transmitted from an infected person,
- 10 <u>animal</u>, or inanimate reservoir to a susceptible host, either directly
- 11 or indirectly through an intermediate plant or animal host, vector, or
- 12 the environment.
- 13 <u>"Contagious disease" means a communicable disease that is capable</u>
- 14 of being easily transmitted from one animal to another animal or a
- 15 human.
- 16 "Director" means the director of agriculture of the state of
- 17 Washington or his authorized representative.
- 18 "Department" means the department of agriculture of the state of
- 19 Washington.
- 20 <u>"Deputized state veterinarian" means a Washington state licensed</u>
- 21 and accredited veterinarian appointed and compensated by the director
- 22 according to state law and department policies.
- "Garbage" means the solid animal and vegetable waste and offal
- 24 together with the natural moisture content resulting from the handling,
- 25 preparation, or consumption of foods in houses, restaurants, hotels,
- 26 kitchens, markets, meat shops, packing houses and similar
- 27 establishments or any other food waste containing meat or meat
- 28 products.
- 29 "Herd or flock plan" means a written management agreement between
- 30 the owner of a herd or flock and the state veterinarian, with possible
- 31 input from a private accredited veterinarian designated by the owner
- 32 and the area veterinarian-in-charge of the United States department of
- 33 agriculture, animal and plant health inspection service, veterinary
- 34 services in which each participant agrees to undertake actions
- 35 specified in the herd or flock plan to control the spread of
- 36 infectious, contagious, or communicable disease within and from an
- 37 infected herd or flock and to work toward eradicating the disease in
- 38 the infected herd or flock.

- "Hold order" means an order by the director to the owner or agent
 of the owner of animals or animal reproductive products which restricts
 the animals or products to a designated holding location pending an
 investigation by the director of the disease, disease exposure, wellbeing, movement, or import status of the animals or animal reproductive
 products.
- "Infectious agent" means an organism including viruses, rickettsia,
 bacteria, fungi, protozoa, helminthes, or prions that is capable of
 producing infection or infectious disease.
- "Infectious disease" means a clinical disease of man or animals
 resulting from an infection with an infectious agent that may or may
 not be communicable or contagious.
- "Livestock" means horses, mules, donkeys, cattle, bison, sheep,
 14 goats, swine, rabbits, llamas, alpacas, ratites, poultry, waterfowl,
 15 game birds, and other species so designated by statute. "Livestock"
 16 does not mean free ranging wildlife as defined in Title 77 RCW.
- 17 <u>"Person" means a person, persons, firm, or corporation.</u>

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- "Quarantine" means the placing and restraining of any animal or its reproductive products by the owner or agent of the owner within a certain described and designated enclosure or area within this state, or the restraining of any animal or its reproductive products from entering this state, as may be directed in an order by the director.
- 23 <u>"Reportable disease" means a disease designated by rule by the</u>
 24 <u>director as reportable to the department by veterinarians and others</u>
 25 <u>made responsible to report by statute.</u>
 - "Veterinary biologic" means any virus, serum, toxin, and analogous product of natural or synthetic origin, or product prepared from any type of genetic engineering, such as diagnostics, antitoxins, vaccines, live microorganisms, killed microorganisms, and the antigenic or immunizing components intended for use in the diagnosis, treatment, or prevention of diseases in animals.
- 32 **Sec. 2.** RCW 16.36.010 and 1927 c 165 s 2 are each amended to read 33 as follows:
- ((The word "quarantine" as used in this act shall mean the placing and restraining of any animal or animals by the owner or agents in charge thereof, either within a certain described and designated enclosure or area within this state, or the restraining of any such animal or animals from entering this state, as may be directed in

- 1 writing by the director of agriculture, or his duly authorized
- 2 representative.)) (1) The director shall supervise the prevention of
- 3 the spread and the suppression of infectious, contagious, communicable,
- 4 and dangerous diseases affecting animals within, in transit through,
- 5 <u>and imported into the state.</u>
- 6 (2) The director may issue a quarantine order and enforce the
- 7 guarantine of any animal or its reproductive products that is affected
- 8 with or has been exposed to disease, either within or outside the
- 9 state. The quarantine shall remain in effect as long as the director
- 10 <u>deems necessary</u>.
- 11 (3) The director may issue a hold order when:
- 12 (a) Overt disease or exposure to disease in an animal is not
- 13 <u>immediately obvious but there is reasonable cause to investigate</u>
- 14 whether an animal is diseased or has been exposed to disease;
- 15 (b) Import health papers, permits, or other transportation
- 16 <u>documents required by law or rule are not complete or are suspected to</u>
- 17 <u>be fraudulent; or</u>
- 18 <u>(c) Further transport of an animal would jeopardize the well-being</u>
- 19 of the animal or other animals in Washington state.
- 20 A hold order is in effect for seven days and expires at midnight on
- 21 the seventh day from the date of the hold order. A hold order may be
- 22 replaced with a quarantine order for the purpose of animal disease
- 23 control.
- 24 (4) Any animal or ((animals so quarantined within the state))
- 25 animal reproductive product placed under a quarantine or hold order
- 26 shall ((at all times)) be kept separate and apart from other
- 27 ((domestic)) animals designated in the instructions of the quarantine
- 28 or hold order, and shall not be allowed to have anything in common
- 29 ((therewith)) with other animals.
- 30 (5) The expenses of handling and caring for any animal or animal
- 31 reproductive product placed under a quarantine or hold order are the
- 32 responsibility of the owner.
- 33 (6) The director has authority over the quarantine or hold area
- 34 until the quarantine or hold order is released or the hold order
- 35 <u>expires</u>.
- 36 (7) Any animal or animal reproductive product placed under a
- 37 quarantine or hold order may not be moved, transported, or sold without
- 38 written approval from the director or until the quarantine or hold
- 39 order is released, or the hold order expires.

- 1 (8) The director may administer oaths and examine witnesses and 2 records in the performance of his or her duties to control diseases 3 affecting animals.
- 4 **Sec. 3.** RCW 16.36.020 and 1987 c 163 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- ((The director shall have general supervision of the prevention of 6 7 the spread and the suppression of infectious, contagious, communicable 8 and dangerous diseases affecting animals within, in transit through and 9 being imported into the state. The director may establish and enforce quarantine of and against any and all domestic animals which are 10 affected with any such disease or that may have been exposed to others 11 thus affected, whether within or without the state, for such length of 12 13 time as he deems necessary to determine whether any such animal is 14 infected with any such disease.))
- 15 <u>(1)</u> The director shall ((also)) enforce and administer the 16 provisions of this chapter pertaining to garbage feeding ((and when 17 garbage has been fed to swine, the director may require the 18 disinfection of all facilities, including yard, transportation and 19 feeding facilities, used for keeping such swine)).
- (2) The director ((shall also have)) has the authority to regulate the sale, distribution, and use of veterinary biologics in the state and may adopt rules to restrict the sale, distribution, or use of any veterinary biologic in any manner ((the director determines to be)) necessary to protect the health and safety of the public and the state's animal population.
- 26 (3) The director has the authority to license and regulate the activities of veterinary laboratories that do not have a veterinarian licensed under chapter 18.92 RCW present within the management or staff of the veterinary laboratory. The director may adopt rules to regulate these laboratories in any manner necessary to protect the health and safety of the public and the public's animals.
- 32 **Sec. 4.** RCW 16.36.040 and 1979 c 154 s 10 are each amended to read 33 as follows:
- 34 (1) The director ((of agriculture shall have power to promulgate))

- 28 **Sec. 5.** RCW 16.36.050 and 1979 c 154 s 11 are each amended to read 29 as follows:
- 30 It ((shall be)) <u>is</u> unlawful for any person((, or any railroad or 31 transportation company, or other common carrier,)) to:
- 32 (1) Bring into this state for any purpose any ((domestic)) animals
 33 without first having secured an official health certificate((7)
 34 certified)) or certificate of veterinary inspection, reviewed by the
 35 state veterinarian of the state of origin that ((such)) the animals
 36 meet the health requirements ((promulgated by the director of
 37 agriculture)) of the state of Washington((: PROVIDED, That)). This
 38 ((section shall)) subsection does not apply to ((domestic animals))

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- livestock imported into this state for immediate slaughter, or ((domestic animals imported for the purpose of unloading for feed, rest, and water, for a period not in excess of twenty-eight hours except upon prior permit therefor secured from the director of agriculture. It shall be 11 unlawful for any person, railroad, transportation company, or other 12 common carrier, to keep any domestic animals which are unloaded for 13 14 feed, rest and water in other than quarantined pens, or not to report 15 any missing animals to the director of agriculture at the time the 16 animals are reloaded));
- 17 (3) Intentionally falsely make, complete, alter, use, or sign an 18 animal health certificate, certificate of veterinary inspection, or 19 official written animal health document of the department;
- 20 (4) Willfully hinder, obstruct, or resist the director, or any 21 peace officer or deputized state veterinarian acting under him or her, 22 when engaged in the performance of their duties; or
- 23 (5) Willfully fail to comply with or to violate any rule or order 24 adopted by the director under this chapter.
- 25 **Sec. 6.** RCW 16.36.060 and 1985 c 415 s 2 are each amended to read 26 as follows:

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((It shall be unlawful for any person to wilfully hinder, obstruct, or resist the director of agriculture or any duly authorized representative, or any peace officer acting under him or them, when engaged in the performance of the duties or in the exercise of the powers conferred by this chapter, and it shall be unlawful for any person to wilfully fail to comply with or violate any rule, regulation or order promulgated by the director of agriculture or his duly authorized representatives under the provisions of this chapter. The director of agriculture shall have the authority under such rules and regulations as shall be promulgated by him to enter at any reasonable time the premises of any livestock owner to make tests on any animals for diseased conditions, and it shall be unlawful for any person to

- 33 **Sec. 10.** RCW 16.36.096 and 1985 c 415 s 4 are each amended to read as follows:

the direction of the state veterinarian.

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((The director of agriculture, in order to protect the public health and welfare, may enter into cooperative programs with the federal government or agencies thereof for the prevention or

eradication of any contagious, infectious, or communicable disease which is affecting or which may affect the health of the animal population of this state.

The director of agriculture may also order the slaughter or destruction of any animal affected with or exposed to such a disease and pay indemnities to the owner of such animal. The actual indemnity amount shall be established by the director by rule. Payment of indemnity does not apply to an animal: (1) Belonging to the federal government or any of its agencies, this state or any of its agencies, or any municipal corporation; or (2) that has been brought into this state in violation of this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter.
