4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 70.123.100 and 1979 ex.s. c 245 s 10 are each amended 5 to read as follows:

6 ((Fifty percent of the funding for shelters receiving grants under 7 this chapter must be provided by one or more local, municipal, or 8 county source, either public or private. Contributions in-kind, 9 whether materials, commodities, transportation, office space, other 10 types of facilities, or personal services, may be evaluated and counted 11 as part of the required local funding.))

The department shall seek, receive, and make use of any funds which may be available from federal or other sources in order to augment state funds appropriated for the purpose of this chapter, and shall make every effort to qualify for federal funding.
