- 1 AN ACT Relating to offenses committed in state parks or parkways;
- 2 amending RCW 43.51.180; and prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.51.180 and 1987 c 380 s 15 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 Every person who:
- 7 (1) Cuts, breaks, injures, destroys, takes, or removes any tree,
- 8 shrub, timber, plant, or natural object in any park or parkway except
- 9 in accordance with such rules as the commission may prescribe; or
- 10 (2) Kills, or pursues with intent to kill, any bird or animal in
- 11 any park or parkway; or
- 12 (3) Takes any fish from the waters of any park or parkway, except
- 13 in conformity with such general rules as the commission may prescribe;
- 14 or
- 15 (4) Willfully mutilates, injures, defaces, or destroys any
- 16 quidepost, notice, tablet, fence, inclosure, or work for the protection
- 17 or ornamentation of any park or parkway; or
- 18 (5) Lights any fire upon any park or parkway, except in such places
- 19 as the commission has authorized, or willfully or carelessly permits

- 1 any fire which he <u>or she</u> has lighted or which is under his <u>or her</u>
- 2 charge, to spread or extend to or burn any of the shrubbery, trees,
- 3 timber, ornaments, or improvements upon any park or parkway, or leaves
- 4 any campfire which he or she has lighted or which has been left in his
- 5 or her charge, unattended by a competent person, without extinguishing
- 6 it; or
- 7 (6) Places within any park or parkway or affixes to any object
- 8 therein contained, without a written license from the commission, any
- 9 word, character, or device designed to advertise any business,
- 10 profession, article, thing, exhibition, matter, or event; or
- 11 (7) Violates any rule adopted, promulgated, or issued by the
- 12 commission pursuant to the provisions of this chapter; shall be guilty
- 13 of a misdemeanor unless the commission has specified by rule, when not
- 14 inconsistent with applicable statutes, that violation of the rule is an
- 15 infraction under chapter 7.84 RCW.
