1 AN ACT Relating to sanitary control of shellfish; and adding a new
2 section to chapter 69.30 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 69.30 RCW
5 to read as follows:

6 (1) A person whose license or certificate of approval is denied,
7 revoked, or suspended as a result of violations of this chapter or
8 rules adopted under this chapter may not:

9 (a) Serve as the person in charge of, be employed by, manage, or
10 otherwise participate to any degree in a shellfish operation licensed
11 or certified under this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter; or

12 (b) Participate in the harvesting, shucking, packing, or shipping
13 of shellfish in commercial quantities or for sale for human
14 consumption.

15 (2) This section applies to a person only during the period of time
16 in which that person's license or certificate of approval is denied,
17 revoked, or suspended.
