- AN ACT Relating to the beef commission; and amending RCW 16.67.040
- 2 and 16.67.051.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 16.67.040 and 1993 c 40 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 There is hereby created a Washington state beef commission to be
- 7 thus known and designated. The commission shall be composed of ((one))
- 8 <u>two</u> beef producers, ((one)) <u>two</u> dairy (beef) producers, ((one)) <u>two</u>
- 9 feeders, one livestock salesyard operator, and one meat packer. If an
- 10 otherwise voting member is elected as the chair of the commission, the
- 11 member may, during the member's term as chair of the commission, cast
- 12 a vote as a member of the commission only to break a tie vote. In
- 14 from the department of agriculture to be designated by the director

addition there will be one ex officio member without the right to vote

- 16 A majority of voting members shall constitute a quorum for the
- 17 transaction of any business.
- 18 All appointed members as stated in RCW 16.67.060 shall be citizens
- 19 and residents of this state, over the age of twenty-five years, each of

- 1 whom is and has been actually engaged in that phase of the cattle
- 2 industry he or she represents for a period of five years, and has
- 3 during that period derived a substantial portion of his or her income
- 4 therefrom, or have a substantial investment in cattle as an owner,
- 5 lessee, partner, or a stockholder owning at least ten percent of the
- 6 voting stock in a corporation engaged in the production of cattle or
- 7 dressed beef, or a manager or executive officer of such corporation.
- 8 Producer members of the commission shall not be directly engaged in the
- 9 business of being a meat packer, or as a feeder, feeding cattle other
- 10 than their own. Said qualifications must continue throughout each
- 11 member's term of office.
- 12 **Sec. 2.** RCW 16.67.051 and 1993 c 40 s 3 are each amended to read 13 as follows:
- 14 Commencing on July 1, 1993, the appointive positions on the
- 15 commission shall be designated as follows: The beef producers shall be
- 16 designated position one <u>and position six</u>; the dairy (beef) producer<u>s</u>
- 17 shall be designated position two <u>and position seven</u>; the feeders shall
- 18 be designated position three <u>and position eight</u>; the livestock
- 19 salesyard operator shall be designated position four; and the meat
- 20 packer shall be designated position five.
- The initial terms of positions one and four shall terminate July 1,
- 22 1994; positions two and five shall terminate July 1, 1995; and position
- 23 three shall terminate July 1, 1996. The initial terms of position six
- 24 shall terminate July 1, 1998; position seven shall terminate July 1,
- 25 1999; and position eight shall terminate July 1, 2000. The regular
- 26 term of office of subsequent appointees shall be three years from the
- 27 date of appointment and until their successors are appointed.
