- (iv) For nonresident graduate ((and law)) students ((not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, eleven thousand six hundred thirty-four)), twelve thousand five hundred eighty-eight dollars;
- 19 (v) For resident law students, five thousand ten dollars;
- 20 <u>(vi) For nonresident law students, twelve thousand nine hundred</u> 21 <u>fifteen dollars;</u>
- 22 <u>(vii)</u> For resident <u>first professional</u> students ((enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, seven thousand four hundred ninety seven)), eight thousand one hundred twelve dollars; and
- ((\(\frac{\(\verticut{vi}\)}{\(\verticut{viii}\)}\)) For nonresident first professional students ((\(\frac{\(\verticut{enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, nineteen thousand four hundred thirty-one)), twenty-one thousand twenty-four dollars.
- 31 (b) At the regional universities and The Evergreen State College:
- (i) For resident undergraduate and all other resident students not in graduate ((study)) programs, two thousand ((forty-five)) two hundred

- (ii) For nonresident undergraduate and all other nonresident students not in graduate ((study)) programs, ((seven thousand nine hundred ninety two)) eight thousand six hundred forty-six dollars;

- 8 (3) Academic year tuition for full-time students at the state's 9 institutions of higher education beginning with the ((1996-97)) 1998-99 10 academic year, other than the summer term, shall be as provided in this 11 subsection unless different rates are adopted in the omnibus 12 appropriations act.
- 13 (a) At the University of Washington and Washington State 14 University:
- (i) For resident undergraduate students and other resident students not in graduate ((study)), law, or first professional programs ((or enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, two thousand eight hundred seventy-five)), three thousand one hundred eight dollars;
- 21 (ii)<u>(A)</u> For nonresident undergraduate students and other nonresident students at the University of Washington not in graduate 22 ((study)), law, or first professional programs ((or enrolled in 23 24 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental 25 surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, nine thousand four hundred 26 ninety-one)), eleven thousand one hundred thirty dollars;
- 27 <u>(B) For nonresident undergraduate students and other nonresident</u>
 28 <u>students at Washington State University not in graduate or first</u>
 29 <u>professional programs, ten thousand two hundred sixty-six dollars;</u>

- (iv) For nonresident graduate ((and law)) students ((not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, twelve thousand one hundred)), thirteen thousand ninety-two dollars;
- (v) For resident law students, five thousand three hundred seventy-39 six dollars;

- 1 (vi) For nonresident law students, thirteen thousand seven hundred 2 eighty-two dollars;
- (vii) For resident first professional students ((enrolled in

- 29 (4) For the 1997-98 and 1998-99 academic years, the University of 30 Washington shall use at least ten percent of the revenue received from 31 the difference between a four percent increase in tuition fees and the actual increase charged to law students to assist needy low and middle-32 income resident law students. For the 1997-98 and 1998-99 academic 33 34 years, the University of Washington shall use at least ten percent of the revenue received from the difference between a four percent 35 increase in tuition fees and the actual increase charged to nonresident 36 undergraduate students and all other nonresident students not in 37 graduate, law, or first professional programs to assist needy low and 38 39 middle-income resident undergraduate students and all other resident

- 4 (5) The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not apply

- 7 through 28A.600.395.
- 8 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.15.069 and 1995 1st sp.s. c 9 s 5 are each amended 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (1) As used in this section, each of the following subsections is 11 a separate tuition category:
- 12 (a) Resident undergraduate students and all other resident students 13 not in first professional, graduate, or law programs;
- 14 (b) Nonresident undergraduate students and all other nonresident 15 students not in <u>first professional</u> graduate or law programs;
- 16 (c) Resident graduate ((and law)) students;
- 17 (d) Resident law students;
- 18 <u>(e)</u> Nonresident graduate ((and law)) students;
- 19 (((e))) (f) Nonresident law students;
- 20 (q) Resident first professional students; and
- 21 $((\frac{f}{f}))$ (h) Nonresident <u>first professional</u> students $(\frac{f}{f})$ (in <u>first</u> 22 professional programs).
- (2) Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, as used in this section "first professional programs" means programs leading to one of the following degrees: Doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, or doctor of veterinary medicine.
- 27 (3) ((For the 1995-96 and 1996-97 academic years,)) The building 28 fee for each academic year shall be a percentage of total tuition fees.
- 29 This percentage shall be calculated by the higher education
- 30 coordinating board and be based on the actual percentage the building
- 31 fee is of total tuition for each tuition category in the 1994-95
- 32 academic year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.
- 33 (4) The governing boards of each institution of higher education,
- 34 except for the technical colleges, shall charge to and collect from
- 35 each student a services and activities fee. A governing board may
- 36 increase the existing fee annually, consistent with budgeting
- 37 procedures set forth in RCW 28B.15.045, by a percentage not to exceed
- 38 the annual percentage increase in student tuition fees for the

- applicable tuition category: PROVIDED, That such percentage increase shall not apply to that portion of the services and activities fee previously committed to the repayment of bonded debt. The services and activities fee committee provided for in RCW 28B.15.045 may initiate a request to the governing board for a fee increase.
 - (5) Tuition and services and activities fees consistent with subsection (4) of this section shall be set by the state board for community and technical colleges for community college summer school students unless the community college charges fees in accordance with RCW 28B.15.515.
- 11 (6) Subject to the limitations of RCW 28B.15.910, each governing 12 board of a community college may charge such fees for ungraded courses, 13 noncredit courses, community services courses, and self-supporting 14 courses as it, in its discretion, may determine, consistent with the 15 rules of the state board for community and technical colleges.
