- 6 (1) It is unlawful for a person to practice or to offer to practice
- 7 as a registered nurse in this state unless that person has been
- 8 licensed under this chapter. A person who holds a license to practice
- 9 as a registered nurse in this state may use the titleg "registered
- 10 nurse" and "nurse" and the abbreviation "R.N." No other person may
- 11 assume ((that)) those titles or use the abbreviation or any other

- 15 as an advanced registered nurse practitioner or as a nurse practitioner

- 18 nurse practitioner in this state may use the titles "advanced
- 19 registered nurse practitioner_" ((and)) "nurse practitioner_" and

- 1 $\underline{\text{"nurse"}}$ and the abbreviations "A.R.N.P." and "N.P." No other person
- 2 may assume those titles or use those abbreviations or any other words,
- 3 letters, signs, or figures to indicate that the person using them is an
- 4 advanced registered nurse practitioner or nurse practitioner.
- 5 (3) It is unlawful for a person to practice or to offer to practice
- 6 as a licensed practical nurse in this state unless that person has been
- 7 licensed under this chapter. A person who holds a license to practice
- 8 as a licensed practical nurse in this state may use the titles
- 9 "licensed practical nurse" and "nurse" and the abbreviation "L.P.N."
- 10 No other person may assume ((that)) those titles or use that
- 11 abbreviation or any other words, letters, signs, or figures to indicate
- 12 that the person using them is a licensed practical nurse.
- 13 (4) Nothing in this section shall prohibit a person listed as a
- 14 Christian Science nurse in the Christian Science Journal published by
- 15 the Christian Science Publishing Society, Boston, Massachusetts, from
- 16 using the title "Christian Science nurse," so long as such person does
- 17 not hold himself or herself out as a registered nurse, advanced
- 18 registered nurse practitioner, nurse practitioner, or licensed
- 19 practical nurse, unless otherwise authorized by law to do so.
