1 AN ACT Relating to the business and occupation taxation of
2 nonprofit organizations providing care for the terminally ill; and
3 amending RCW 82.04.4289.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 82.04.4289 and 1993 c 492 s 305 are each amended to
6 read as follows:

7 This chapter does not apply to amounts derived as compensation for
8 services rendered to patients or from sales of prescription drugs as
9 defined in RCW 82.08.0281 furnished as an integral part of services
10 rendered to patients by a kidney dialysis facility operated as a
11 nonprofit corporation, a nonprofit hospice agency licensed under
12 chapter 70.127 RCW, and nursing homes((7)) and homes for unwed mothers
13 operated as religious or charitable organizations, but only if no part
14 of the net earnings received by such an institution inures directly or
15 indirectly, to any person other than the institution entitled to
16 deduction hereunder.
