1 AN ACT Relating to salmon species enrichment license plates; and 2 adding new sections to chapter 46.16 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. In order to help fund the restoration of 5 salmon and steelhead species listed under the federal endangered 6 species act, a voluntary program is created that will allow the 7 purchase of special motor vehicle license plates. The additional funds 8 from the plates shall be used for restoration projects developed under 9 chapter 75.46 RCW or RCW 75.56.050.

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. The salmon species enrichment license fees 11 account is created in the state treasury. All receipts from salmon 12 species enrichment license fees must be deposited into the account. 13 Moneys in the account may be spent only after appropriation. 14 Expenditures from the account may be used only for the preservation, 15 protection, perpetuation, and enhancement of salmon species.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. The department and the department of fish 17 and wildlife shall jointly develop the design of the salmon species enrichment license plate. The department may adopt rules necessary to
 implement sections 1 through 12 of this act.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. Any person who is the registered owner of a passenger motor vehicle, a motor truck, a trailer, a camper, a private 4 bus, or a motorcycle registered with the department, excluding 5 proportionally registered vehicles, or who makes application for an 6 7 original registration or renewal registration of such vehicle or camper may, upon payment of the fee prescribed in section 8 of this act, apply 8 9 to the department for salmon species enrichment license plates, in the manner described in section 7 of this act, which plates shall be 10 affixed to the vehicle or camper for which registration is sought in 11 12 lieu of the regular license plates.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. The salmon species enrichment license plates 14 shall be the design selected under section 3 of this act and shall 15 consist of numbers, letters, or both, as established by the department 16 by rule.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. The salmon species enrichment license plates 18 shall be issued only to the registered owner of a vehicle on which they 19 are to be displayed.

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. An applicant for issuance of salmon species 21 enrichment license plates or renewal of such plates in the subsequent 22 year pursuant to this chapter shall file an application therefor in 23 such form and by such date as the department may require.

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. In addition to the regular registration fee, 25 and any other fees and taxes required to be paid upon registration, the 26 applicant shall be charged a fee of thirty-five dollars. In addition to the regular renewal fee, and in addition to any other fees and taxes 27 required to be paid, the applicant for a renewal of such plates shall 28 29 be charged an additional fee of twenty-five dollars. All salmon 30 species enrichment license plates must be renewed on an annual basis, regardless of whether a vehicle on which they are displayed will not be 31 32 driven on public highways or may also be eligible to display permanent license plates valid for the life of such vehicle without annual 33 34 renewal. Salmon species enrichment license plates that are not renewed

1 must be surrendered to the department, and failure to do so is a
2 traffic infraction.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 9. Whenever any person who has been issued 4 salmon species enrichment license plates applies to the department for 5 transfer of such plates to a subsequently acquired vehicle or camper 6 eligible for salmon species enrichment license plates, a transfer fee 7 of five dollars shall be charged in addition to all other appropriate 8 fees. Such transfer fees shall be deposited in the motor vehicle fund.

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 10. When any person who has been issued salmon species enrichment license plates sells, trades, or otherwise releases 10 11 ownership of the vehicle upon which the salmon species enrichment license plates have been displayed, he or she shall immediately report 12 13 the transfer of such plates to an acquired vehicle or camper eligible for salmon species enrichment license plates, pursuant to section 9 of 14 15 this act, or he or she shall surrender such plates to the department. Failure to surrender such plates is a traffic infraction. 16

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 11. The director of licensing may establish 18 such rules as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of sections 1 19 through 10 of this act.

20 NEW <u>SECTION.</u> Sec. 12. Administrative costs incurred by the 21 department as a direct result of sections 1 through 12 of this act 22 shall be appropriated by the legislature from the salmon species enrichment license fee account created in section 2 of this act. 23 Ιf the actual costs incurred by the department are less than that which 24 25 has been appropriated by the legislature the remainder shall revert to 26 the state salmon species enrichment license fee account.

27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 13.** Sections 1 through 12 of this act are each 28 added to chapter 46.16 RCW.
