- 1 AN ACT Relating to treatment of intractable pain with controlled
- 2 substances; adding a new chapter to Title 69 RCW; and declaring an
- 3 emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** This chapter shall be known and may be cited
- 6 as the intractable pain treatment act.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The definitions in this section apply
- 8 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 9 (1) "Intractable pain" means pain a person feels despite reasonable
- 10 efforts to eliminate or alleviate the source of the pain. The source
- 11 may be known or not known.
- 12 (2) "Reasonable efforts" means efforts to find the source of pain
- 13 and include appropriate referrals by the attending physician.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** Health professionals authorized in this
- 15 state to prescribe controlled substances may treat intractable pain
- 16 with controlled substances included in Schedules II through V as
- 17 identified in this title. This section does not address treatment of

- 1 conditions other than intractable pain with controlled substances
- 2 included in Schedules II through V.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The licensing entity for health
- 4 professionals authorized in this state to prescribe controlled
- 5 substances may not take action against the health professional's
- 6 license, if the health professional follows the accepted standard of
- 7 care for treatment of intractable pain with controlled substances
- 8 included in Schedules II through V and the licensed health professional
- 9 obtains informed consent.
- 10 Standard of care and informed consent are further described in
- 11 chapter 7.70 RCW. Under RCW 18.130.340 the secretary of health shall
- 12 coordinate and assist the regulatory boards and commissions of the
- 13 health professions with prescriptive authority in the development of
- 14 uniform guidelines for addressing treatment of intractable pain with
- 15 controlled substances included in Schedules II through V. The
- 16 guidelines may be revised as necessary.
- 17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The department of health is authorized to
- 18 adopt rules to implement this chapter.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** Prescription of controlled substances
- 20 included in Schedules II through V for intractable pain by a health
- 21 professional authorized in this state to prescribe controlled
- 22 substances is not a criminal offense.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. The department of labor and industries shall
- 24 develop guidelines for treatment of intractable pain and informed
- 25 consent that are consistent with the department of health's guidelines.
- 26 The department of labor and industries is authorized to make rules to
- 27 implement this act.
- 28 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** Licensed health professionals who do not
- 29 have authority to prescribe, but do have authority to administer or
- 30 otherwise perform tasks inherent to the patient taking the
- 31 prescription, are authorized to administer or perform their tasks in
- 32 cases where controlled substances included in Schedules II through V
- 33 are prescribed for intractable pain. Licensing actions and criminal
- 34 sanctions cannot be pursued because controlled substances included in

- 1 Schedules II through V are used for intractable pain, as long as the
- 2 health professional follows the accepted standard of care and obtains
- 3 informed consent for treatment of intractable pain.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** If any provision of this act or its
- 5 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 6 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 7 persons or circumstances is not affected.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 10.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 9 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 10 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 11 immediately.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 11.** Sections 1 through 10 of this act
- 13 constitute a new chapter in Title 69 RCW.
