## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5076

State of Washington 56th Legislature 1999 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to Puget Sound marine fish preserves; adding a new 2 section to chapter 75.54 RCW; and creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the continued 5 survival of marine bottomfish species in Puget Sound and adjacent 6 waters requires that preserves be established for their protection 7 within different geographical and ecological zones and that fishing and 8 harvesting of marine bottomfish and other fish be prohibited within the 9 preserves.

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 75.54 RCW 11 to read as follows:

12 (1) The fish and wildlife commission shall establish marine 13 bottomfish preserves that encompass at least twenty percent of the 14 rocky reef habitat throughout Puget Sound, the Straits of Juan de Fuca, 15 Admiralty Inlet, the San Juan Islands, and the Straits of Georgia. The 16 purpose of establishing marine bottomfish preserves is to protect 17 marine bottomfish species from overfishing, and to allow a safe haven 18 for spawning, growth, and maturation of marine bottomfish, and to

establish focal points where recolonization of marine bottomfish may 1 occur into ecosystems that are currently depleted of marine bottomfish. 2 The commission shall select preserve locations that are rich in 3 4 habitat features that are required by depleted marine bottomfish 5 species or are needed by bottomfish species that need to be enhanced. In establishing marine bottomfish preserves the commission shall 6 7 identify areas that are appropriate for protection of lingcod, rockfish 8 species, cabezon, greenling, and other species of bottomfish.

9 The commission may allow recreational diving in selected marine 10 bottomfish preserves, provided that spearfishing and collecting of 11 marine bottomfish and other fish shall not be allowed in any marine 12 bottomfish preserve, and that the recreational diving activities will 13 not decrease or diminish achieving the primary purpose of protection of 14 marine bottomfish.

The commission shall not authorize any recreational or commercial fishing or harvesting of marine bottomfish and other fish within marine bottomfish preserves and may close the preserves to the harvest of other marine organisms.

19 The commission shall conduct public hearings within the affected 20 area of proposed marine bottomfish preserves and seek public input 21 before establishing marine bottomfish preserves.

The commission shall closely involve treaty Indian tribes in the process of selecting and approving marine bottomfish preserves. Prior to establishment of marine bottomfish preserves the commission shall obtain agreement from the treaty Indian tribes who are affected by proposed marine bottomfish preserves that they will not harvest bottomfish from the preserves.

(2) The commission shall report to the appropriate committees of
the legislature by January 1, 2000, and every other year subsequently,
on the progress and needs of the marine bottomfish preserve program.
