1 AN ACT Relating to motor vehicle theft; amending RCW 9A.56.070,
2 9.94A.360, and 13.40.0357; reenacting and amending RCW 9.94A.320; and
3 prescribing penalties.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 9A.56.070 and 1975 1st ex.s. c 260 s 9A.56.070 are
6 each amended to read as follows:

7 (1) Every person who shall without the permission of the owner or
8 person entitled to the possession thereof intentionally take or drive
9 away any automobile or motor vehicle, whether propelled by steam,
10 electricity, or internal combustion engine, the property of another,
11 shall be deemed guilty of a felony, and every person voluntarily riding
12 in or upon said automobile or motor vehicle with knowledge of the fact
13 that the same was unlawfully taken shall be equally guilty with the
14 person taking or driving said automobile or motor vehicle and shall be
15 deemed guilty of taking a motor vehicle without permission.

16 (2) Taking a motor vehicle without permission is a class ((E)) B
17 felony.

22 **Sec. 3.** RCW 9.94A.360 and 1998 c 211 s 4 are each amended to read
23 as follows:

24 The offender score is measured on the horizontal axis of the
25 sentencing grid. The offender score rules are as follows:

26 The offender score is the sum of points accrued under this section
27 rounded down to the nearest whole number.

28 (1) A prior conviction is a conviction which exists before the date
29 of sentencing for the offense for which the offender score is being
30 computed. Convictions entered or sentenced on the same date as the
31 conviction for which the offender score is being computed shall be
32 deemed "other current offenses" within the meaning of RCW 9.94A.400.

33 (2) Class A and sex prior felony convictions shall always be
34 included in the offender score. Class B prior felony convictions other
35 than sex offenses shall not be included in the offender score, if since
36 the last date of release from confinement (including full-time
37 residential treatment) pursuant to a felony conviction, if any, or
38 entry of judgment and sentence, the offender had spent ten consecutive

1 years in the community without committing any crime that subsequently
2 results in a conviction. Class C prior felony convictions other than
3 sex offenses shall not be included in the offender score if, since the
4 last date of release from confinement (including full-time residential
5 treatment) pursuant to a felony conviction, if any, or entry of
6 judgment and sentence, the offender had spent five consecutive years in
7 the community without committing any crime that subsequently results in
8 a conviction. Serious traffic convictions shall not be included in the
9 offender score if, since the last date of release from confinement
10 (including full-time residential treatment) pursuant to a felony
11 conviction, if any, or entry of judgment and sentence, the offender
12 spent five years in the community without committing any crime that
13 subsequently results in a conviction. This subsection applies to both
14 adult and juvenile prior convictions.

15 (3) Out-of-state convictions for offenses shall be classified
16 according to the comparable offense definitions and sentences provided
17 by Washington law. Federal convictions for offenses shall be
18 classified according to the comparable offense definitions and
19 sentences provided by Washington law. If there is no clearly
20 comparable offense under Washington law or the offense is one that is
21 usually considered subject to exclusive federal jurisdiction, the
22 offense shall be scored as a class C felony equivalent if it was a
23 felony under the relevant federal statute.

24 (4) Score prior convictions for felony anticipatory offenses
25 (attempts, criminal solicitations, and criminal conspiracies) the same
26 as if they were convictions for completed offenses.

27 (5)(a) In the case of multiple prior convictions, for the purpose
28 of computing the offender score, count all convictions separately,
29 except:

30 (i) Prior offenses which were found, under RCW 9.94A.400(1)(a), to
31 encompass the same criminal conduct, shall be counted as one offense,
32 the offense that yields the highest offender score. The current
33 sentencing court shall determine with respect to other prior adult
34 offenses for which sentences were served concurrently or prior juvenile
35 offenses for which sentences were served consecutively, whether those
36 offenses shall be counted as one offense or as separate offenses using
37 the "same criminal conduct" analysis found in RCW 9.94A.400(1)(a), and
38 if the court finds that they shall be counted as one offense, then the
39 offense that yields the highest offender score shall be used. The

1 current sentencing court may presume that such other prior offenses
2 were not the same criminal conduct from sentences imposed on separate
3 dates, or in separate counties or jurisdictions, or in separate
4 complaints, indictments, or informations;

5 (ii) In the case of multiple prior convictions for offenses
6 committed before July 1, 1986, for the purpose of computing the
7 offender score, count all adult convictions served concurrently as one
8 offense, and count all juvenile convictions entered on the same date as
9 one offense. Use the conviction for the offense that yields the
10 highest offender score.

11 (b) As used in this subsection (5), "served concurrently" means
12 that: (i) The latter sentence was imposed with specific reference to
13 the former; (ii) the concurrent relationship of the sentences was
14 judicially imposed; and (iii) the concurrent timing of the sentences
15 was not the result of a probation or parole revocation on the former
16 offense.

17 (6) If the present conviction is one of the anticipatory offenses
18 of criminal attempt, solicitation, or conspiracy, count each prior
19 conviction as if the present conviction were for a completed offense.

20 (7) If the present conviction is for a nonviolent offense and not
21 covered by subsection (11) or (12) of this section, count one point for
22 each adult prior felony conviction and one point for each juvenile
23 prior violent felony conviction and 1/2 point for each juvenile prior
24 nonviolent felony conviction.

25 (8) If the present conviction is for a violent offense and not
26 covered in subsection (9), (10), (11), or (12) of this section, count
27 two points for each prior adult and juvenile violent felony conviction,
28 one point for each prior adult nonviolent felony conviction, and 1/2
29 point for each prior juvenile nonviolent felony conviction.

30 (9) If the present conviction is for Murder 1 or 2, Assault 1,
31 Assault of a Child 1, Kidnapping 1, Homicide by Abuse, or Rape 1, count
32 three points for prior adult and juvenile convictions for crimes in
33 these categories, two points for each prior adult and juvenile violent
34 conviction (not already counted), one point for each prior adult
35 nonviolent felony conviction, and 1/2 point for each prior juvenile
36 nonviolent felony conviction.

37 (10) If the present conviction is for Burglary 1, count prior
38 convictions as in subsection (8) of this section; however count two
39 points for each prior adult Burglary 2 or residential burglary

1 conviction, and one point for each prior juvenile Burglary 2 or
2 residential burglary conviction.

3 (11) If the present conviction is for a felony traffic offense
4 count two points for each adult or juvenile prior conviction for
5 Vehicular Homicide or Vehicular Assault; for each felony offense or
6 serious traffic offense, count one point for each adult and 1/2 point
7 for each juvenile prior conviction. This subsection shall not apply
8 when additional time is added to a sentence pursuant to RCW
9 46.61.520(2).

10 (12) If the present conviction is for a drug offense count three
11 points for each adult prior felony drug offense conviction and two
12 points for each juvenile drug offense. All other adult and juvenile
13 felonies are scored as in subsection (8) of this section if the current
14 drug offense is violent, or as in subsection (7) of this section if the
15 current drug offense is nonviolent.

16 (13) If the present conviction is for Willful Failure to Return
17 from Furlough, RCW 72.66.060, Willful Failure to Return from Work
18 Release, RCW 72.65.070, or Escape from Community Custody, RCW
19 72.09.310, count only prior escape convictions in the offender score.
20 Count adult prior escape convictions as one point and juvenile prior
21 escape convictions as 1/2 point.

22 (14) If the present conviction is for Escape 1, RCW 9A.76.110, or
23 Escape 2, RCW 9A.76.120, count adult prior convictions as one point and
24 juvenile prior convictions as 1/2 point.

25 (15) If the present conviction is for Burglary 2 or residential
26 burglary, count priors as in subsection (7) of this section; however,
27 count two points for each adult and juvenile prior Burglary 1
28 conviction, two points for each adult prior Burglary 2 or residential
29 burglary conviction, and one point for each juvenile prior Burglary 2
30 or residential burglary conviction.

31 (16) If the present conviction is for a sex offense, count priors
32 as in subsections (7) through (15) of this section; however count three
33 points for each adult and juvenile prior sex offense conviction.

34 (17) If the present conviction is for taking a motor vehicle
35 without permission, count two points for each prior adult and juvenile
36 conviction for this offense.

37 (18) If the present conviction is for an offense committed while
38 the offender was under community placement, add one point.
