- 1 AN ACT Relating to adverse possession; and adding new sections to
- 2 chapter 7.28 RCW.

- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the statutory law
- 5 governing the elements of adverse possession should be explicitly
 - stated in the statute in order to allow people to more clearly
- 7 understand property rights in this state. Section 2 of this act sets
- 8 forth the common law elements presently required in Washington before
- 9 a claim for adverse possession of real property will be granted. The
- 10 legislature intends to add the element of "honest belief" to the common
- 11 law elements of adverse possession, which are: Actual, open,
- 12 notorious, exclusive, hostile, and continuous possession. The
- 13 legislature intends that prior to taking property from the true owner,
- 14 the adverse possessor must hold an honest belief that he or she is the
- 15 true owner of the property in question.
- 16 The provisions of this section are not intended to change any of
- 17 the statutory law or common law elements of adverse possession relating
- 18 to colorable title or payment of taxes.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) A person may acquire title to real 2 property by adverse possession only if:
- 3 (a) The person has maintained actual, open, notorious, exclusive,
- 4 hostile, and continuous possession of the property for the period set
- 5 forth in RCW 4.16.020;
- 6 (b) At the time the person claiming by adverse possession first 7 entered into possession of the property, the person entering into 8 possession had the honest belief that he or she was the actual owner of 9 the property and that belief:
- 10 (i) By the person continued throughout the vesting period;
- 11 (ii) Had an objective basis; and
- 12 (iii) Was reasonable under the particular circumstances; and
- 13 (c) The person proves each of the elements set forth in this 14 section by clear and convincing evidence.
- 15 (2) A person maintains hostile possession of property if the 16 possession is adverse to that of the true owner.
- 17 (3) The adverse possessor obtains the same interest in the property 18 that the person who owned the present possessory estate held when the 19 adverse possession began.
- 20 (4) If a person is claiming property under this section by 21 utilizing the interests of a predecessor in interest, that predecessor 22 in interest must also have met the requirements of subsection (1)(a),
- 23 (b), and (c) of this section.
- 24 (5) This section applies to civil actions filed on or after July 1, 25 1999.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. Sections 1 and 2 of this act are each added to chapter 7.28 RCW.
