- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 8.26.075 and 1988 c 90 s 7 are each amended to read as 5 follows:
- 6 (1) If a program or project undertaken by a displacing agency
- cannot proceed on a timely basis because comparable replacement dwellings are not available, and the head of the displacing agency 8
- 9 determines that the dwellings cannot otherwise be made available, the
- 10 head of the displacing agency may take such action as is necessary or
- appropriate to provide the dwellings by use of funds authorized for the 11
- 12 The displacing agency may use this section to exceed the project.
- 13 maximum amounts that may be paid under RCW 8.26.045 and 8.26.055 on a
- 14 case-by-case basis for good cause as determined in accordance with
- 15 rules adopted by the lead agency.
- (2) No person may be required to move from a dwelling on account of 16
- 17 any program or project undertaken by a displacing agency unless ((the
- 18 displacing agency is satisfied that)) comparable replacement housing is
- 19 available to the person.

- 1 (3) The displacing agency shall assure that a person shall not be 2 required to move from a dwelling unless the person has had a reasonable 3 opportunity to relocate to a comparable replacement dwelling, except in 4 the case of the following:
- 5 (a) A major disaster as defined in section 102(2) of the Federal 6 Disaster Relief Act of 1974;
 - (b) A national emergency declared by the president; or

8 (c) Any other emergency that requires the person to move 9 immediately from the dwelling because continued occupancy of the 10 dwelling by the person constitutes a substantial danger to the health 11 or safety of the person.
